10.1. Approving various routine parking and traffic modifications (The Planning Department has found that Items A-M are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act [CEQA]. For these parking and traffic modifications that received a categorical exemption, the proposed SFMTA Board action constitutes the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the SF Administrative Code. Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.):

- A. ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, ANY TIME, Mission Street, south side, from 206 feet to 226 feet west of South Van Ness Avenue (removes meter #1629)

- G. ESTABLISH – BLUE ZONE, Connecticut Street, west side, from 20 feet to 33 feet south of 16th Street, Arkansas Street, west side, from 20 feet to 33 feet south of 16th Street.
- H. RESCIND – 45-DEGREE ANGLED PARKING, ESTABLISH – PERPENDICULAR PARKING, Harrison Street, east side, from 62 feet to 270 feet south of 23rd Street (208-foot zone), Harrison Street, east side, from 23rd Street to 320 feet northerly (320-foot zone).
- I. RESCIND – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, 7 AM TO 9 AM, Post Street, north side, from Taylor Street to Mason Street, Post Street, north side, from Mason Street to 55 feet west of Powell Street, Post Street, north side, from Powell Street to Stockton Street, Post Street, north side, from Stockton Street to 80 feet west of Grant Avenue.
- J. ESTABLISH – RED ZONE, Potrero Avenue, east side, from Alameda Street to 20 feet southerly (20-foot zone), Alameda Street, south side, from Potrero Avenue to 23 feet westerly (23-foot zone), Alameda Street, north side, from Potrero Avenue to 20 feet easterly (20-foot zone).
- K. RESCIND – BLUE ZONE, ACCESSIBLE PARKING, AT ALL TIMES, Alameda Street, south side, from 18 feet to 38 feet west of Potrero Avenue (20-foot zone).
- L. ESTABLISH – BLUE ZONE, ACCESSIBLE PARKING, AT ALL TIMES, Alameda Street, south side, from 23 feet to 47 feet west of Potrero Avenue (24-foot zone), Potrero Avenue, east side from 20 feet to 44 feet south of Alameda Street (24-foot zone).
- M. ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, Alameda Street, south side, from Potrero Avenue to Hampshire Street, Potrero Avenue, east and west sides, from Alameda Street to 15th Street.
- N. RESCIND – TOW AWAY NO STOPPING ANY TIME, EXCEPT COMMERCIAL LOADING, 30 MINUTE LIMIT, ESTABLISH – TOW AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME, Powell Street, west side from 84 feet to 174 feet north of Ellis Street, Powell Street, east side, from 92 feet to 152 feet north of Ellis Street, Powell Street, east side, from 97 feet to 177 feet north of O’Farrell Street.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call 415.554.5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
