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Citizens' General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee

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OVERVIEW

Committee meetings are held once every 2 months, if possible, but no less than once a quarter on the 4th Thursday of the month. The schedule is posted annually.

ON March 5th, 2002 the San Francisco voters adopted Proposition F, the Citizen Oversight of Bond Expenditures Initiative. The Ordinance established a committee of nine members for the purpose of informing the public concerning the expenditure of general bond proceeds through active review and the publishing of regular reports. The ordinance required that the nine members meet certain minimum qualifications and be appointed as follows: three members by the Mayor, three members by the Board of Supervisors, two members by the Controller and one member by the Civil Grand Jury. Each member serves for a term of two years and may be re-appointed for a second two-year term.

On November 4, 2003, the voters added to the duties of the Committee by approving Proposition C, which requires the Controller to serve as the City Services Auditor. The Ordinance also added to the duties of the Committee by requiring that it serve as a Citizens Audit Review Board. In this role, the Committee provides advisory input to the Controller on matters set forth in the Ordinance, including requiring that the Committee: 1) review the Controller's service standards and benchmarks to ensure their accuracy and usefulness; 2) review all audits to assure they meet requirements set forth in the Ordinance; 3) review complaints received through the Controller's Whistleblower Hotline and their disposition; and 4) when appropriate, hold public hearings regarding the results of benchmark studies and audits.

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WHAT WE DO

The BOC has been established to provide public oversight regarding the expenditure of bond proceeds for projects funded by the SFMTA's revenue bonds and other forms of indebtedness to ensure that bond proceeds are being spent for authorized purposes in accordance with law. Its purpose is to ensure accountability and transparency for SFMTA debt financed projects, and to ensure that prudent internal controls and practices are established and implemented by the SFMTA. The BOC also informs the SFMTA Board of Directors and the public on status of the projects funded by debt. The BOC's authority does not include the approval of projects included in any financing nor participation or interference in the selection process of any vendor hired to execute bond-funded projects or issue debt. The BOC Committee consists of seven members and oversees the spending of bond proceeds and inform the Board and the public on status of the projects funded by debt.

SAN FRANCISCO MUNICIPAL TRANSPORTATION AGENCY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

RESOLUTION No. 11-154

WHEREAS, The purpose of the bond oversight committee is to provide oversight to the SFMTA to ensure that bond proceeds are being spent on permitted purposes and to establish prudent internal controls and practices; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed SFMTA bond oversight committee will consist of seven members and will oversee the spending of bond proceeds and inform the Board and the public on status of the projects funded by debt; and,

WHEREAS, All proceedings of the bond oversight committee shall be subject to the California Public Records Act (Section 6254, et seq., of the Government Code of the State of California) and the City's Sunshine Ordinance (Chapter 67 of the Government Code of the State of California) and minutes of the proceedings of the bond oversight committee and all documents received and reports issued shall be a matter of public record and be made available on the SFMTA's Website; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the SFMTA Board of Directors authorizes the creation of a bond oversight committee to oversee the expenditure of bond proceeds for projects funded by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency's revenue bonds and other forms of indebtedness with the following seven members:

(1) Three members recommended by the Chairman and approved by the SFMTA Board of Directors;

(2) Two members of the Citizens' Advisory Council;

(3) One member appointed by the Director of Transportation; and

(4) One member appointed by the Controller.
