Whether you are riding Muni, taking a taxi, walking, riding a bike or driving, please remain vigilant to keep everyone safe. If you see suspicious activity, please report it.**

Families Belong Together March and Rally

Saturday, June 30: The “Families Belong Together” march will leave Dolores Park at 10 a.m., proceed along Dolores Street to Market Street, then continue on Market Street to Polk Street, where it will turn north and continue to a rally in Civic Center Plaza in front of City Hall. The rally is expected to last from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

There will be disruptions to Muni service and traffic congestion should be expected in the vicinity of the march route and Civic Center. Motorists are advised to allow extra travel time.

A street closure of Dr Carlton B Goodlett Place between McAllister and Grove streets will be in effect from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Fourth of July: Extra Muni Service, Parking Will Be Enforced

Wednesday, the Fourth of July holiday, Muni will operate on a [Sunday schedule](#), but [extra Muni service](#) will be provided to and from the fireworks display on The Embarcadero. The 76X Marin Headlands Express Muni bus will be in service. See below for more information.

Parking meters and seven-day street sweeping will be enforced citywide on the holiday. Residential parking permits and Monday-Friday daytime street sweeping and commuter towaway will not be enforced.

Vehicles creating a hazard and/or an unsafe condition (i.e. double parking, blocking a bike lane, blocking driveways, blocking crosswalks, fire hydrants, etc.) are subject to receiving citations and can possibly be towed.

Note: Parking meters in the City are enforced Monday through Saturday **with the exception of the following areas where parking meters are enforced seven days per week throughout the year except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day:**

- Parking meters in the Fisherman's Wharf area

Annual July 4 Independence Day Fireworks Celebration

Wednesday, July 4: The July 4 annual Independence Day Fireworks Celebration will start at 2 p.m. along the waterfront near the Municipal Pier and Pier 39. Entertainment will be at Pier 39, Aquatic Park and Ghirardelli Square. The fireworks display will begin at 9:30 p.m. **Muni will operate on a [Sunday schedule](#), but [extra Muni service](#) will be provided to and from the fireworks display on The Embarcadero. The 76X Marin Headlands Express Muni bus will be in service.**

Starting from around noon to 11 p.m., large crowds and heavy traffic should be expected to and from Treasure Island.

At approximately 8:30 p.m., no traffic will be allowed north of Lombard Street, from Van Ness to Doyle Drive, except for residents.

As many as 200,000 people are expected in the event area. Traffic congestion and disruption of transit service are expected in the northern section of the city. To ensure safety of the riding public, customers should pay attention to their surroundings and allow extra travel time to get around the City.

The following street closures will be in effect:

 - Southbound Polk Street between Bay and Union streets (except for Muni, bicycles and taxis)
- 8:30 p.m. to midnight, Wednesday
 - Marina Boulevard exit off Doyle Drive may be closed

 - Jefferson Street from Aquatic Park to Hyde Street
- 6 a.m., Wednesday to 4 a.m., Thursday
 - The Embarcadero between Powell and Mason streets
- 8 a.m. to 11:30 p.m., Wednesday
 - Van Ness Avenue between North Point Street and the Municipal Pier Terminus
 - Beach Street from Polk Street to the Terminus
- 11 a.m., Wednesday to 4 a.m., Thursday
 - Jefferson Street between Hyde and Powell streets
- 9:20 to 10:15 p.m., Wednesday
 - Northbound Embarcadero between Broadway and Bay Street

Note: As the crowd grows and to ensure safety of pedestrians, SFPD Police Officers and SFMTA Parking Control Officers can decide to close Fisherman's Wharf area bounded by The Embarcadero, Van Ness Avenue and Bay Street earlier than the scheduled time listed above to vehicular traffic.

To expedite transit flow following the fireworks, southbound traffic on Polk Street between Bay and Union streets will be restricted to buses, taxis and bicycles only between 9 and 11 p.m. Northbound traffic on Polk Street will not be affected.

July 4 Muni Service: Additional Shuttle Service to the Fireworks and Express Shuttles from the Fireworks

On July 4, Muni will operate on a Sunday schedule as well as the added service detailed below. Muni Metro will start service at 8 a.m.

Pre-Event Service

Starting at 2 p.m. until 8:30 p.m., Muni will provide extra service to connect people from Muni Metro Subway, BART, Ferries and Caltrain to both viewing areas: **1) Along Van Ness Avenue, from Market Street to the Aquatic Park; and 2) Along The Embarcadero, from Caltrain Station to the Pier 39.**

Post-Event Service

Return express shuttle service will begin after the fireworks display at around 9 p.m. until 11:30 p.m. Shuttles will board at two locations:

- Kearny and North Point streets for service to the Ferry Building and Caltrain station
- Polk and Francisco streets for service to Civic Center Muni/BART Station

Once the crowds disperse, regular Muni service will resume. This can take at least a half hour. Participants and those traveling in the area are asked to allow extra travel time.

Purchasing Muni Fare

Between 2:30 and 8:30 p.m., SFMTA staff will be selling transfers at the Ferry Building. Muni customers are encouraged to purchase their round-trip fare in advance or use a Clipper® Card. Regular Muni fares apply:

- \$2.75 for adults (age 19-64)
- \$1.35 for seniors (ages 65 and older), youth (5-18)
- \$1.35 for people with disabilities
- All single ride fares paid for by cash or Clipper Card will receive the regular 90-minute transfer

Muni Reroutes

The following regular Muni lines and routes will be re-routed due to congestion in the event area: **E Embarcadero***; **F Market & Wharves****; **8 Bayshore Express**; **19 Polk**; **30 Stockton**; **39 Coit**; **47 Van Ness** and **49 Van Ness-Mission**.

* **The E Embarcadero line** will only operate as streetcars until 2 p.m. After 2 p.m. bus shuttles will operate along The Embarcadero to 4th and King/Townsend Streets on Wednesday, July 4.

** **The F Market & Wharves line** will operate on regular Muni buses all day on Wednesday, July 4.

The Powell-Hyde, Powell-Mason and California cable car lines will operate on regular Muni buses at 5 p.m., 8 p.m. and 9 p.m. respectively.

The following Muni routes may be affected after the fireworks due to the increased number of transit customers and the high volume of pedestrian traffic: **28 19th Avenue**; **91 Owl**; **22 Fillmore**; **45 Union-Stockton** and **76X Marin Headland Express**.

- Muni customers can purchase one-way Muni transfers at the AT&T Park ticket windows located at 2nd and King streets and Willie Mays Plaza. Transfers will be sold from two hours before the game until the game begins, and again from the beginning of the 7th inning until 30 minutes after the game ends.
- Baseball fans transferring from BART may purchase round trip Muni transfer tickets at the Embarcadero Station two and a half hours prior to the start time of the game.
- Transfers will be valid for up to two hours after the end of event.

Muni Ticket Sales - In Person

Muni customers may purchase their fare in advance on-board vehicles and at any Muni ticket vending machine.

Event participants are encouraged to use Clipper® Card to get to AT&T Park. Customers using Bay Area public transportation systems are strongly encouraged to purchase their fares in advance or use Clipper® Card to attend the event. Customers using a Clipper Card receive 50 cents off an adult single ride when transferring to Muni from BART, Golden Gate Ferry and Transit, and San Francisco Bay Ferry routes (Oakland-Alameda, Harbor Bay and Vallejo). Golden Gate Ferry and Transit and San Francisco Bay Ferry provide the same discount on return trips.

Purchase Muni Fare using MuniMobile

Event participants may use [MuniMobile](#), an official SFMTA app, to save time by instantly buying tickets for Muni bus, rail, cable car, and paratransit services on their iPhone and Android devices. Tickets can be purchased through a credit/debit card or PayPal account for individual or multiple riders on one smartphone. Customers can buy tickets ahead of time and activate when they are ready to ride - with MuniMobile, your phone is your fare.

Purchase Single Ride Muni Fare Electronically

Muni customers who purchase fares in advance using a Clipper® Card or use the official SFMTA app, [MuniMobile](#), can save 25 cents per trip. A single ride fare on Muni is good for 90 minutes of travel, whether it be on a single route or a trip with multiple transfers across buses and light rail.

As a reminder to fans, in order to reduce congestion on city streets after all events at AT&T Park, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets from the seventh inning until after the post-game traffic has died down. Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street (Peter R. Maloney) Bridge will be closed to all traffic except streetcars, buses, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period. Giants fans parked south of Mission Creek Channel who are heading north of the channel are encouraged to exit to the south along 3rd or 4th streets in order to avoid congestion on King and 3rd streets after AT&T Park events.

CONSTRUCTION WORK AND OTHER UPDATES

ONGOING: Twin Peaks Tunnel Improvements Project

Since Monday, June 25, the Twin Peaks Tunnel is closed for approximately two months. With 100 years of service under its belt, the Twin Peaks Tunnel is in need of extensive interior work to continue to operate safely and reliably for years to come.

The vital part of our transit system connects Castro Station to West Portal Station and serves 80,000 K Ingleside, L Taraval and M Ocean View customers every day.

The tunnel's infrastructure, including the tracks, walls and drainage systems, must be maintained in a timely manner to keep up with the demands of the Muni system. Twin Peaks Tunnel is currently under a speed restriction, which slows down trains as they travel through. Replacing the tracks will lift the tunnel's speed restriction and keep trains running reliably through the system. Seismic reinforcements will better protect the tunnel's overall structure and stability.

Construction started on Monday, June 25 with a continuous closure of the tunnel for approximately two months. Work is taking place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. During the closure, Forest Hill and West Portal stations are closed. The K Ingleside travels on a shortened route and the bus service runs for the L Taraval and M Ocean View lines. **Nx buses has been temporarily suspended during the closure**, there are additional train service on N Judah line.

Below are details of transit changes:

- Starting Monday, June 25, for two months, the Twin Peaks Tunnel, West Portal Station and Forest Hill Stations are closed.
- K trains run a shortened route between Sloat/St. Francis and Balboa Park. Once K Ingleside trains reach Balboa Park, they continue downtown as J Church trains.
- L buses run instead of trains between the SF Zoo and Church Station.
- M buses run instead of trains between Balboa Park and Church Station
- L and M Buses stop at both Castro and Church stations where customers can transfer to and from Muni Metro underground.
- M and K customers going downtown are encouraged to transfer to BART at Balboa Park. Free BART tickets to Embarcadero will be available Monday through Friday, from 6 to 10 a.m.
- Forest Hill Shuttle connects Forest Hill to West Portal.
- For Forest Hill Station, use L bus or Forest Hill Shuttle only.
- For West Portal Station, use M bus or Forest Hill Shuttle only.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

The Van Ness Improvement Project is a civic improvement project that will bring San Francisco's first Bus Rapid Transit system. To maximize the benefits of construction, the City will also be replacing major utilities including water, sewer and emergency firefighting water systems. Work will also be done to repave Van Ness Avenue, enhance streetlights and landscaping, and install new sidewalk lighting and rain gardens.

Traffic lanes on Van Ness Avenue have been shifted to create two construction zones for upcoming utility work. Because some of this work requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction, some work is limited to nighttime hours. Neighbors will be notified of night noise 72-hours in advance of night work.

Friday, June 29, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.:

- **Geary Street:** Crews are scheduled to work on water main installation.
- **From Golden Gate Avenue to Turk Street:** Crews are scheduled to work on updating the emergency firefighting water system. Disruptive noise is expected.
- **From McAllister to Mission streets:** Crews are scheduled to prepare the area for upcoming work.
- **From Mission to Market streets:** Crews are scheduled to pothole to confirm underground utilities for upcoming sewer work.

Neighbors are advised to anticipate construction-related noise, as crews work diligently to complete necessary night work.

Northbound Van Ness at Hayes Left Turn Scheduled for Removal on July 6

The left turn northbound from Van Ness Avenue onto Hayes Street is scheduled to be removed on Friday, July 6, 2018.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project *continued*

Left turns have been permanently removed all along Van Ness Avenue, except for northbound at Lombard Avenue and southbound at Broadway, as part of the Van Ness Improvement Project goals to increase safety and improve traffic circulation.

Drivers who currently make the left turn from Van Ness Avenue at Hayes are advised to [test new routes](#) before the left turn is eliminated.

In the early morning hours of Thursday, July 12, following the removal of the left turn at Hayes, northbound traffic lanes on Van Ness Avenue between Mission and McAllister will shift to make room for construction.

UPDATE: Central Subway Project

Construction of the 4th and Brannan streets surface station platform is ongoing. Until further notice, traffic reroutes will remain in effect.

Sewer replacement work continues Monday through Friday, from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. at 4th and Howard streets. Two through lanes are in place southbound 4th Street. Westbound traffic on Howard Street may be impacted. Utility work on Folsom Street between 4th and 5th streets may occur between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m., reducing Folsom Street to two lanes on this block.

One lane on the south side of Ellis Street is open at all times for eastbound traffic. The parking garage between Ellis and O'Farrell is accessible on the north side of Ellis Street. Street restoration work is continuing on the north side of the intersection of Ellis and Stockton streets.

Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley is under a long-term temporary closure to vehicular traffic as station construction continues. Pedestrian access to Washington Street between Stockton Street and Trenton Alley remains open. The pedestrian walkway scaffolding along the west side of Stockton Street south of Washington Street may be disassembled in the coming weeks, Pedestrian access through this area will be temporarily rerouted.

The Central Subway project is the first underground line to link the north and south corridors of the city, and will provide a direct connection to major retail, sporting and cultural venues while efficiently transporting people to jobs, educational opportunities and other amenities throughout San Francisco.

UPDATE: M Ocean View Safety and Transit Improvement Project

The M Ocean View Improvement Project will repair vital transit infrastructure and improve safety for people who walk and use Muni on 19th Avenue. The improvements include installing vehicle safety measures at the trackway entrances, replacing the rail and upgrading traffic signals. Temporary lane shifts are now active in the area and drivers are advised that travel times may increase.

After successful completion of Phase One, track replacement between Winston and Rossmore drives as well as pedestrian safety and performance improvements have now begun in Phase 2 of the project. To support this work, some lane shifts on 19th Avenue have already been implemented and will continue throughout the project.

In order to create a safer work area, the curb lane will be closed on 19th Avenue between Winston and Rossmore in the northbound direction. Additionally, the crews will be working in the east sidewalk, however pedestrian access will remain open.

The larger track replacement work will coincide with the Twin Peaks Tunnel Improvements Project, during which the M train will be substituted with a bus. [The Twin Peak Tunnel Improvement Project](#) which began on Monday, June 25 and will continue for approximately two months. Crews plan to take advantage of this bus substitution to work on the rails.

ONGOING: UCSF Mission Bay Arena Platform Project

In anticipation of the new Golden State Warriors' Chase Center and growth in the Mission Bay, the SFMTA is constructing a new center platform along 3rd Street between South and 16th streets. This new, larger platform will service both the inbound and outbound trains and greatly expand transit capacity in preparation for large crowds.

Construction work is ongoing, with decommission of the Muni platform planned for December and a new platform anticipated to be completed and in service in early summer of 2019. Bus substitutions will serve the T-Third line during parts of construction.

ONGOING: Construction of Mission Bay Loop

The SFMTA has resumed construction on 18th, 19th and Illinois streets, the project is expected to be completed in late 2018.

The Mission Bay Loop is a key component for San Francisco's T Third rail line and is critical to operating the T Third Central Subway service plan. The loop provides turn-around capabilities for the T Third Street light rail line via a connection of trackway from 3rd Street to 18th, Illinois and 19th streets, which will allow the SFMTA to operate the necessary service levels needed to support current and planned growth within the eastern portion of San Francisco.

Traffic, including travelling by bike, may be affected by the construction work. All work areas will be clearly marked and there will be flaggers to help direct traffic.

In order to conduct the work, parking on both sides including along the historical Crane Cove Park fence (east side of Illinois Street) will be removed 24 hours, 7 days a week from 18th to 19th and Illinois streets for the duration of the project.

Traffic lanes traveling both north and south will remain open and there will be flaggers posted to help direct traffic. The northbound bike lane will be converted to a shared roadway. Expect minor delays when traveling around and through the construction area.

Local access to properties along the project site will be maintained. Sewer work is scheduled to be completed by summer 2018.
