Congestion is Coming Back





Physical Distancing Reduces Capacity by Two-Thirds







Temporary Emergency Transit Lanes

- Keep Muni moving and reduce crowding
- Complete trips in less time, return to service more quickly
- Provide more frequent service with same number of buses/trains
- Automatically removed within 120 days after emergency order is lifted, unless there is a public process to make a lane permanent
- Will not be painted red





Program Benefits

- Equity: Transit lanes <u>reduce the risk</u> of exposure for people who have <u>the fewest travel choices</u> and ensure there is enough capacity on board, especially for lower-income people of color
- Public Health: Reducing crowding on transit reduces the risk of COVID-19 transmission
- Economic Recovery: A strong economic recovery is dependent on an efficient transit system





Temporary Emergency Transit Lanes: Proposed Phasing





T-Third – 4th Street Bridge

- Only location between Bayview and Downtown where T-Third shares lanes with traffic
- Project would improve T-Third travel time and reliability
 - Less time waiting at traffic lights near 4th/King station
 - Less variability in travel time more consistent spacing of train arrivals
 - Helps trains avoid getting stuck in traffic
- Proposed implementation January 2021

Existing Traffic Pattern

Auto traffic is currently permitted in both directions on the 4th Street Bridge





Auto traffic would continue to be allowed **southbound** on the 4th St Bridge

Auto traffic would continue to be allowed **southbound** on the 4th St Bridge

Auto traffic would be prohibited **northbound** on the 4th St Bridge





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Left turn restrictions **northbound** and **southbound** at 4th/Berry, requiring detours





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4th St northbound auto traffic would detour
