### **BRIEF DESCRIPTION:**

Approving various routine parking and traffic modifications.

#### **PURPOSE**

To approve various routine parking and traffic modifications.

#### STRATEGIC PLAN GOALS AND TRANSIT FIRST POLICY PRINCIPLES:

- Goal 1: Create a safer transportation experience for everyone
  - Objective 1.1: Achieve Vision Zero by eliminating all traffic deaths.
  - Objective 1.2: Improve the safety of the Transit System.
- Goal 2: Make transit and other sustainable modes of transportation the most attractive and preferred means of travel
  - Objective 2.1: Improve transit service.
  - Objective 2.2: Enhance and expand use of the city's sustainable modes of transportation.
  - Objective 2.3: Manage congestion and parking demand to support the Transit First
    - Policy.

This action supports the following SFMTA Transit First Policy Principles:

- 1. To ensure quality of life and economic health in San Francisco, the primary objective of the transportation system must be the safe and efficient movement of people and goods.
- 2. Public transit, including taxis and vanpools, is an economically and environmentally sound alternative to transportation by individual automobiles. Within San Francisco, travel by public transit, by bicycle and on foot must be an attractive alternative to travel by private automobile.
- 3. Decisions regarding the use of limited public street and sidewalk space shall encourage the use of public rights of way by pedestrians, bicyclists, and public transit, and shall strive to reduce traffic and improve public health and safety.

#### **ITEMS**

The following items were considered at Public Hearing on January 22, 2021 and February 19, 2021.

- A. ESTABLISH ONE WAY STREET 24th Street, eastbound, from Minnesota Street to Tennessee Street
- B. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME 23rd Street, north side, from 28 feet west of Minnesota Street to 32 feet easterly, (2.5-foot wide bulb), 25th Street, north side, from Minnesota Street to 23 feet easterly (6-foot wide bulb), Minnesota Street, east side, from 23rd Street to 23 feet southerly (6-foot wide bulb). (Both A and B were requested by Public Works)

Modification A is designed to improve safety and convert the street from a two way into a one-way street. Modification B is designed to improve pedestrian infrastructure with sidewalk extensions.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

The proposed traffic and parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The SFMTA, under authority delegated by the San Francisco Planning Department, has determined that the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Item A (2021–001354ENV) is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301.

The proposed action is the Approval Action for Item A as defined by San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31.

On October 1, 2020, the San Francisco Planning Department determined that Item B is within the scope of the Better Streets Plan Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (FMND, Case No. 2007.1238E) as adopted by the Planning Department on September 15, 2010, and that the proposal would not require the preparation of a subsequent negative declaration under CEQA Guidelines section 15162. Subsequently, on October 28, 2010, the Planning Commission in Resolution No. 18211, adopted findings under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the CEQA Guidelines, and Chapter 31 of the Administrative Code (CEQA Findings), and a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP), associated with the Better Streets Plan. The SFMTA Board of Directors adopts these findings as its own, and to the extent the above actions are associated with any mitigation measures, the SFMTA Board of Directors adopts those measures as conditions of this approval.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency has received a request, or identified a need for parking and traffic modifications as follows:

- A. ESTABLISH ONE WAY STREET 24th Street, eastbound, from Minnesota Street to Tennessee Street.
- B. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME 3rd Street, north side, from 28 feet west of Minnesota Street to 32 feet easterly, 25th Street, north side, from Minnesota Street to 23 feet easterly, Minnesota Street, east side, from 23rd Street to 23 feet southerly, and;

WHEREAS, The proposed traffic and parking modifications are subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA); CEQA provides a categorical exemption from environmental review for operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA, under authority delegated by the San Francisco Planning Department, has determined that the proposed parking and traffic modifications in Item A (Case 2021–001354ENV) is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Section 15301; and,

WHEREAS, The proposed action is the Approval Action for Item A as defined by San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 31; and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the CEQA determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and may be found in the records of the Planning Department at <a href="https://sfplanning.org/">https://sfplanning.org/</a> and 49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400 in San Francisco, and is incorporated herein by reference; and,

WHEREAS, On September 15, 2010, the San Francisco Planning Department adopted the Better Streets Plan Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (Better Streets Plan FMND, Case No. 2007.1238E), and under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the CEQA Guidelines, and Chapter 31 of the Administrative Code—the San Francisco Planning Commission adopted CEQA Findings, a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP) on October 28, 2010 under Motion 18211; and,

WHEREAS, On October 1, 2020, the San Francisco Planning Department determined that Item B is within the scope of the Better Streets Plan FMND and that Item B would not require the preparation of a subsequent negative declaration under CEQA Guidelines Sections 15162 and 15168; and,

WHEREAS, The SFMTA Board of Directors has reviewed the Better Streets Plan Final Mitigated Negative Declaration (FMND) and finds that since adoption of the FMND, no changes have occurred in the proposed project or in the circumstances under which the project would be implemented that would cause new significant impacts or a substantial increase in the severity of impacts identified and analyzed in the FMND, and that no new information has emerged that would materially change the analysis or conclusions set forth in the FMND; The actions approved herein would not necessitate implementation or additional or considerably different mitigation measures that those identified in the FMND; and,

WHEREAS, The public has been notified about the proposed modifications and has been given the opportunity to comment on those modifications through the public hearing process; and further be it,

RESOLVED, The SFMTA Board of Directors adopts these CEQA findings as its own, and to the extent the above actions are associated with any mitigation measures, the SFMTA Board of Directors adopts those measures as conditions of this approval; a copy of the Planning Commission Resolution, the CEQA findings, and the CEQA determination are on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and may be found in the records of the Planning Department at <a href="https://sfplanning.org/">https://sfplanning.org/</a> and 49 South Van Ness Avenue, Suite 1400 in San Francisco, and is incorporated herein by reference; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors, upon recommendation of the Director of Transportation and the Director of the Streets Division approves the changes.
