Taxi Plastic Shield Requirement

Discuss on-going status of Plastic Taxi Shield Requirement
 Established in June 2021 to increase driver and passenger safety during the pandemic



- Separate rear passenger area from front seating
- Allow passenger access to rear Passenger Payment
 Device
- Allow Paratransit customers to hand card to driver
- Not impede access to safety seatbelts
- SFMTA provided 800+ plastic shields to Color Schemes at no cost. Color Schemes and Medallion Holders responsible for installation and maintenance and procuring additional shields, as needed

SFO Operations: Front Seat Passenger Policy

- Current SFO Implementation
 - Many travelers are in parties of 4
 - Drivers Choice place optional placard to designate desire for no front-seat rider
 - Group riders matched with appropriate taxi vehicle

Paratransit Taxi Tip

Current Tipping Policy for SF Paratransit Taxi

- 10% of the meter fare, up to \$2
- Tipping is optional with consent from rider
- Either tip or no tip option
- No change since 2009

Updated Tipping Policy

- Effective September 1st, tipping will be 15% of the meter fare, up to \$4
- Applies for all SF Paratransit taxi programs (ADA, Essential Trip Card, Paratransit Plus, Shop-a-Round, CHOICE)



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SFMTA Considering Raising Taxi Meter Rates

Taximeter rates have not increased since 2011 Inflation in Bay Area is 41% overall and 41% for transportation since 2011 Fuel costs peaked over 200% last 2 years, price fluctuates Request from taxi industry Rate increase goes directly to driver



Current Taxi Meter Rates

Taxi Service	Fare Amount		
First one-fifth mile of flag rate (Flag Drop)	\$3.50		
Each additional one-fifth mile or fraction thereof	\$0.55		
Each minute of waiting or traffic time delay	\$0.55		
SFO pick-up fee (100% customer pass through)	\$5.50		
Bridge Tolls	Paid by passenger		
Out-of-Town trips (greater than 15 miles beyond SF)	150% of fare		

Recent Fare Surcharges in Other Jurisdictions

Cities Enacting Trip Surcharges				
Houston	\$0.50 per trip			
Seattle	\$1 per trip			
Las Vegas	\$0.39 increase / metered mile			
Chicago (proposed)	\$1 for trips < \$20 \$2 for trips \$20-\$40 \$3 for trips > \$40			

Recent Fare Adjustments in Other Jurisdictions

Cities Raising Base Fare (Flag Drop)				
Toronto	\$1 per trip			
New York (proposed)	\$2.50 increase from \$3.30 to \$5.80			

Cities Raising Fares	
Montreal	17% increase in fares and increased rates allowed for late night rides
Los Angeles	Flag increase to \$3.10, \$0.33 per 1/9th mile and per 37 seconds of wait time

Taxi Meter Rate Summary

SFMTA Staff's Proposals based on Research / Feedback

- Initial analysis
 - Flag Drop: \$0.65 increase
 from \$3.50 to \$4.15
 - Time + Distance: \$0.10 increase
 from \$0.55 to \$0.65
 - ~18% overall increase



SF Trip Characteristics Jan-May 2022

Median cost for all trips: \$12.85

Metered Fare for Five Mile Trip

*cost of living is higher in SF

Estimated Cost Impact to General Public Rider for a Typical Trip

Draft Proposal (Flag Drop/ Time, Distance)	Flag Drop	Distance/ Wait Time	15% Tip	Total Cost	Rider Share Increase
Current FY21/22	\$3.50	\$10.45	\$2.09	\$16.04	
Proposed +\$0.65/ +\$0.10	\$4.15	\$12.35	\$2.48	\$18.98	\$2.94

Initial Staff Considerations

- Considered fuel surcharge
- Fares based on time of day or location
- Meter and a half structure

Not proposing either fuel surcharge or other fare restructuring at this time, but may consider them in the future



Impacts on Paratransit Riders

- SFMTA would increase allotment for Paratransit riders and for Essential Trip Card programs and maintain subsidy ratio
- Currently SFMTA subsidizes
 Taxi Trips through the
 Paratransit Taxi Debit Card
 - 80% Subsidy by SFMTA
 - 20% Paid by Rider



Estimated Cost Impact to Paratransit Rider for a Typical Trip

Paratransit Trips were ~13% of all taxi trips in last fiscal year

Approval Process for Rate Change

Gather Community Feedback

- Rate change must be approved by SFMTA Board, targeting late fall meeting
- Rate change would take effect 30 days after SFMTA Board approval

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Upfront Fare Pilot Program

- SFMTA issued <u>Pilot Rules</u> on August 5, 2022
 - Key program rules include driver ability to opt out of 3rd party trips with no penalty
 - Data requirements
- Applications for Pilot participation are due to SFMTA by September 15th
- No applications have been received as of 8.24.22



Upfront Fare Key Rules

- Drivers may opt out of third-party trips without any penalty
- 2. Applicants must send data on all trips to SFMTA
- 3. Apps must send SFMTA what the fare would have been by taxi meter
- 4. Fares for taxi e-hail originated trips must be based on the meter rate, including meter and a half trips
- 5. Fares for third-party trips do not have to be based on taxi meter rates
- 6. Driver fee schedule must be reported before the pilot begins
- 7. Only a limited number of third-party dropoffs allowed at SFO, and no pick-ups

 Increase the Number of Drivers
 Track Complaints
 Study Impact on Traditional Taxi Trips
 Comparison of Upfront Fares and Meter Rates
