

Sustainable Streets Division Directive Order No. 6831

Pursuant to the public hearing held on November 8, 2024, traffic movement and safety may be improved by the changes approved below. The Environmental Clearance for these items is noted on Order No. 6828.

1. ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA S (Eligibility only, no signs)

24th Street, both sides, between Castro Street and Noe Street (Supervisor District 8) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Lulu Brien, lulu.brien@sfmta.com

The proposed modification would add RPP eligibility to the residents of the 4000 block of 24th Street, both sides, between Castro Street and Noe Street (excluding parcels that already have eligibility: 4000-4011, 4021-4030, 4035, 4037, 4042, 4044, 4046, 4064, 4066, 4063, 4065, 4067, 4069, 4071) so that they can purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within RPP Area S.

Proposal to convert 6 motorcycle parking spaces to 1 general metered parking spaces based on lack of use. The 6 motorcycle spaces closest to Mission Street will be maintained.

Proposal to convert parking on Sutter Street and Webster Street to General Metered Parking with no time limit to provide consistency in parking regulations with the east side of Webster Street and the adjacent blocks of Sutter Street, as well as promote parking turnover and improve parking availability for staff and visitors of businesses along the corridor.

Public Comments: Comment received during public hearing in support of time limit rescission and in opposition to meter establishment. Suggestion made for RPP eligibility. Received email in opposition to item 3(b) after public hearing.

Proposal requested by the public to remove general 1-HOUR time-limited parking on the south side of 30th Street, between Dolores Street and San Jose Avenue, as well as replacing general 1-HOUR time limit on 30th Street, between Mission Street and San Jose Avenue to General Metered Parking with no time limit to promote parking turnover and availability for residents, as well as staff and visitors of businesses in the vicinity of 30th Street.

Public Comments: Received emails prior to public hearing in support of time limit rescission and in opposition to meter establishment.

Decision: Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.

Proposal to establish 4-Hour weekday parking time limit on both sides of 19th Avenue, between Holloway Avenue and Buckingham Way, to support parking availability for SF State University faculty, students, staff, and visitors.

Public Comments: Received 28 emails in support and 5 emails in opposition prior to public hearing. Comment in opposition received during public hearing citing concerns over traffic lane removal and potential congestion as a result, parking loss on Baker Street, and recent signal timing changes causing slower progression. Comments in support received during public hearing. Request made for better bike wayfinding signage. Suggestion made to consider having only one eastbound left turn lane at Masonic Avenue to keep bikeway on the roadway instead of into Panhandle. **Decision:** Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.
