47th Avenue, east side, from Vicente Street to 35 feet southerly (Supervisor District 4) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Dustin White, dustin, white @sfmta.com

Proposal to restrict parking across residential driveways to improve Muni turning clearance.

<u>Drumm Street, between Clay Street and Washington Street – Parking Meters</u>

2. RESCIND – METERED MOTORCYCLE PARKING ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

Drumm Street, west side, from 118 feet to 260 feet north of Clay Street (Supervisor District 3) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Andy Thornley, andy.thornley@sfmta.com

Proposal to convert underutilized motorcycle parking on the west side of the 200 block of Drumm Street to standard metered parallel parking (7 stalls), with 28 metered motorcycle stalls retained.

- **3(b). ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE** 29th Street, south side, from 13 feet to 30 feet east of Dolores Street
- **3(c). ESTABLISH RED ZONE**29th Street, north side, from Dolores Street to 20 feet easterly



- **3(d). RESCIND TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE**Belcher Street, west side, from 14th Street to 20 feet northerly
- **3(e). ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE** Belcher Street, west side, from 10 feet to 28 feet north of 14th Street
- 3(f). ESTABLISH RED ZONE

Proposal to rescind and re-establish existing on-street car share parking spaces to insert proper intersection daylighting, per Assembly Bill 413.

ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filling a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
