Proposal to stop the stem of this T-intersection to formalize the right-of-way.

### 3. ESTABLISH - NO PARKING ANYTIME

This proposal restricts parking next to the school's campus entrance gate to allow proper access to the campus.

### <u>Cole Street at Carl Street – Car Share Parking</u> 4(a). RESCIND – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE

Cole Street, west side, from 20 feet to 62 feet north of Carl Street



### 4(b). ESTABLISH - TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, EXCEPT PERMITTED CAR SHARE

Frederick Street, north side, from Cole Street to 36 feet westerly (Supervisor District 8) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Andy Thornley. andy.thornley@sfmta.com

Proposal to relocate two existing on-street car share parking spaces to restore two general metered spaces in Cole Valley's commercial area.

### **Evans Avenue, between Rankin Street and Quint Street – Parking–Protected Bikeway and Transit Boarding Island**

### 5(a). ESTABLISH - TOW-AWAY, NO PARKING ANY TIME

- A. Evans Avenue, south side, from Rankin Street to 193 feet easterly (removes 7 unmetered parking spaces in the vicinity of rail crossing)
- B. Evans Avenue, south side, from 483 feet to 678 feet east of Rankin Street (removes 9 unmetered parking spaces)
- C. Evans Avenue, north side, from Rankin Street to 220 feet westerly (makes permanent removal of 10 parking spaces)

### 5(b). RESCIND - BUS POLE STOP

Evans Avenue, south side, west of Quint Street (replaced by boarding island)

### 5(c). ESTABLISH – TRANSIT BOARDING ISLAND

Evans Avenue, south side, 578 feet to 628 feet east of Rankin Street (Evans outbound boarding island in Quint Street "T" intersection)

(Supervisor District 10) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Ellen Robinson, ellen.robinson@sfmta.com

Proposal to convert the parking lane on the south side of Evans Avenue from Rankin Street to Quint Street (previously closed for adjacent construction project) to floating parking with a curbside bikeway following partial block repaying. Increases the length of parking restriction around the midblock Union Pacific Railroad crossing and converts the outbound pole stop for the 19-Polk Muni bus route to a boarding island.

The following items have been environmentally cleared by the Planning Department on May 15, 2017, Addendum to San Francisco Bicycle Plan EIR (Case 2007.0347ENV-10):

6. RESCIND - YELLOW METERED ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 30-MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY **ESTABLISH - NO STOPPING, EXCEPT BICYCLES** 

**ESTABLISH - BIKE SHARE STATION** 

Kearny Street, west side, from 14 feet to 72 feet north of California Street (stalls #1, 3, 5)

Proposal to install a bike share station in the parking lane on the west side of Kearny Street, north of California Street, adjacent to 600 California Street office building.

# Folsom Street at 1<sup>st</sup> Street – Bikeshare Station 7. ESTABLISH – NO STOPPING, EXCEPT BICYCLES ESTABLISH – BIKE SHARE STATION

Folsom Street, north side, from 30 feet to 125 feet west of 1<sup>st</sup> Street (Supervisor District 6) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) bikeshare@sfmta.com

Proposal to relocate the 1<sup>st</sup> /Folsom bikeshare station around the corner into the floating buffer on the north side of Folsom Street, west of 1<sup>st</sup> Street, and convert the station to angled docks so it fits in the 6-foot-wide buffer.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filling a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
