

# Safer Market Street

June 16, 2015 MTAB Presentation Vision Zero: The City's Policy Commitment to eliminate all traffic-fatalities citywide by 2024

- Market Street identified as high-injury corridor
  - 162 injury collisions between
    2012-2013 from 8<sup>th</sup> to 3<sup>rd</sup> streets
  - 4 of the top 20 intersections for pedestrian injury collisions
  - Top 2 intersections for bicycle injury collision




Break down of 162 injury Collisions



## Outreach

- Conducted Intercept Survey Summer 2014
  - 84% of respondents arriving by modes other than private vehicle
- 2 Community Workshops (September, November)
- Mailed out notices for workshops and hearing to ~8,700 recipients
- Continuous updates and briefings with key stakeholders
- Strategic communications with GPS navigation providers


### SFMTA Proposed Conditions: Turn Restrictions



 Private vehicles generally not allowed to turn onto Market between 3<sup>rd</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> Streets

- Buses, bicycles, taxis, commercial and emergency vehicles and paratransit would be exempt
- Restrictions divert traffic through out the network to improve safety conditions


### SFMTA Proposed Conditions: Transit Only Lanes



Transit-only lanes extended to reduce lane

changes and improve transit reliability

### **Proposed Conditions: Loading Zones**




- Legal movement
  - Existing White Zone adjacent to Market Street
- Current White Zone to be Yellow
- Existing Yellow Meter to be removed
- New White Zone
- 🗢 New Blue Zone

SEMTA

- 4 new blue disabled parking zones
- 8 new white passenger loading zones



### Supplemental Safety Treatments



### Khaki painted bulbs at

- Grant Avenue
- Mason Street
- Two on 3<sup>rd</sup> Street
- 7<sup>th</sup> Street
- 8<sup>th</sup> Street



# Effects on Traffic

- Environmental analysis indicated no significant impacts
- 30-50% of cars diverted off of Market Street
- 3-25% increase on the adjacent network
  - West of 6<sup>th</sup> Street would experience lesser traffic increases
  - East of 6<sup>th</sup> Street would experience more noticeable traffic increases
  - Traffic patterns likely to disperse over time through out the network



# **Implementation Plan**

- Construction is being implemented with SFMTA Sign, Paint and Meter shops to minimize impacts
- Digital message signs pre/during/post construction with Safer Market Street project information
- Partnered with SFMTA parking control officers and SFPD to direct traffic and cite violators
