


Approval of Minutes

- Project schedule
 - Preparing the roadway for construction through March 2017
 - Utility work: April 2017-September 2018
 - Side A: April 2017-March 2018
 - Side B: October 2017-September 2018



Finalizing permits



- Construction update
 - Construction in the median began Dec. 19
 - Removal of median including concrete curbs, trees and contaminated soil has begun on northern blocks
 - Night work has included removal of Overhead Contact System lines that power buses







- Construction update
 - Construction in the median began Dec. 19
 - Number of lanes continues to be reduced in two-block segments as construction expands
 - Wet winter weather has delayed some work







- Construction update
 - Double parking and deliveries
 - SFPD will step up enforcement during construction
 - Prepare now by reviewing existing loading zones and delivery schedules
 - Coordinate to relocate loading zones to side streets, alleys
 - If needed, apply to adjust loading zone hours
 - Reach out to delivery companies to let them know about upcoming construction and appropriate loading areas
 - SFMTA reaching out to Uber, Lyft

- Lighting on Van Ness update
 - Working to resolve resolution for alternative design
 - Developing design and budget



- Polk Streetscape Project update
 - Construction on North Point from Van Ness to Larkin and on Polk from Beach to Vallejo is underway
 - North Point through March 2017
 - Beach to Vallejo through September 2017
 - Traffic signal upgrades begin this month



Union Street Shopping Signage

Merchants expressed concerns about left turn elimination impacting holiday sales

- Signs were produced and posted within project corridor to direct customers to Union Street shopping
- Collaboration with project staff, Sup. Farrell's office and Union Street Merchants
- Short-term solution for holiday shoppers
- Left turn removals are legislated and permanent
- Meeting planned with stakeholders to identify possible long-term solutions




Union Street Shopping Signage


- Merchants expressed concerns regarding left turn elimination impacting holiday sales
 - Four wayfinding signs were posted to direct customers to Union Street shopping district without left turns from Van Ness
 - Collaboration with project staff, Sup. Farrell's office and Union Street Merchants
 - Short-term solution for holiday shoppers
 - Left turn removals are legislated and permanent, so staff is looking for possible long-term solutions


- Recent public engagement activities
 - Middle PolkNeighborhoodAssociation
 - War Memorial Board of Trustees
 - Ongoing night noise notifications
 - Quarterly CulturalGroups coordination



- Recent public engagement activities
 - Historic Preservation Commission hearing
 - Long-term treatment plan for four trolley/light poles
 - Information provided about work on alternate design trolley/light pole to address resolution
 - Unique shelter design for McAllister Street stations









2016 in Review:

- Launched Van Ness Business Advisory
 Committee, the agency's first such committee.
- Launched quarterly newsletter, printed and mailed twice annually to more than 30,000 project neighbors.
- Met with 24 community, merchant and stakeholder groups to provide project information and coordinate for construction.
- Testified at six hearings including three Board of Appeals, SF Arts Commission, City Hall Historic Preservation Advisory Commission and MTA Board.
- Launched multilingual interactive text messaging campaign to acquire new contacts to inform and engage over the duration of the project.

2016 in Review:

- Conducted successful multichannel outreach campaigns for bus stop consolidation, the Open House, a bus stop relocation and the start of construction.
 - Campaigns included multilingual ambassador outreach, canvassing door hangers, mailers to more than 34,000 project neighbors, on-street signage, service alerts, NextMuni alerts, in-vehicle announcements, press releases, homepage rotator, website updates, blog articles, social media and email and text message series.
- Released a three video series and animation to provide the public with project and construction information.





2016 in Review:

- Began hosting twice-weekly community drop-in office hours at construction office. Office hours are Tuesdays 2:00-4:00 p.m. and Fridays 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. (holidays excluded).
- Hosted Construction Open House, providing project and construction information about the Van Ness Improvement Project and Polk Streetscape Project to about 200 community members.
- Launched monthly project briefing for public officials.


