



FOR PROPOSED PARKING & TRAFFIC CHANGES

Pursuant to SFMTA Order No. 5692 adopted December 21, 2016, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency will hold a public hearing to solicit public input on the following proposed changes. The hearing will be held as follows:

Date/Time: Friday, January 6, at 10:00 am

Location: Room 416 (Hearing Room 4), City Hall, San Francisco

(located on Van Ness Avenue between McAllister and Grove Streets)

ESTABLISH - METERED MOTORCYCLE PARKING

Berry Street, west side, from 6 feet to 46 feet north of 4th Street (10 motorcycle spaces removing 2 general meter parking spaces #184 and #186) *

ESTABLISH - TOW-AWAY, NO PARKING ANYTIME

3rd Street, east side, from Howard Street to 201 feet northerly (replaces the 7-9 AM, 3-6 PM Monday to Friday peak hour tow-away regulation and five parking meters to create a full-time area for active loading)

ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

- A. San Jose Avenue, south side, from Havelock Avenue to 27 feet westerly
- B. San Jose Avenue, north side, from San Juan Avenue to 20 feet easterly *
- C. San Jose Avenue, south side, from Baden Street to 25 feet westerly
- D. San Jose Avenue, south side, at Baden Street from west crosswalk to 28 feet easterly (removes parking within this T-intersection, approximately 1 space)

ESTABLISH - PERPENDICULAR PARKING

- A. Bryant Street, east side, from 18 feet to 186 feet south of 22nd Street
- B. Bryant Street, east side, from 126 feet to 202 feet north of 23rd Street
- C. Bryant Street, west side, from 28 feet to 126 feet north of 23rd Street

ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

Brunswick Street, north side, from 15 feet west of Roemer Way west curb line to 20 feet easterly (20-foot extension of existing 12-foot red zone) *

ESTABLISH - RED ZONE

Buchanan Street, east side, from Market Street to 79 feet northerly

ESTABLISH – STOP SIGN

Dormitory Road, southbound, at Kiska Road/Kirkwood Avenue, stopping the stem of this T-intersection

Items denoted with an asterisk (*) can be approved by the City Traffic Engineer after the public hearing and such approval constitutes the CEQA **Approval Action** under S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). Otherwise, the SFMTA Board will make the final approval at a later date based on the outcome at the public hearing.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which viewed online may be at http://www.sfplanning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision

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ESTABLISH - TOW AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME

Fulton Street, north side, from Cole Street east property line to 25 feet easterly

ESTABLISH – RED ZONE

Hanover Street, south side, from 9.5 feet to 39.5 feet west of Watt Avenue (extends existing red zone by 30 feet) *

RESCIND - NO PARKING EXCEPT BICYCLES (FOR BIKE SHARE STATION)

Grant Avenue, west side, from 4 feet to 44 feet north of Columbus Street

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RESCIND – BUS ZONE

- A. 22nd Street, south side, from Pennsylvania Street to 100 feet easterly (restores 1 unmetered space; remaining bus zone is a bulb-out)
- B. 22nd Street, south side, from Iowa Street to 80 feet easterly (restores 4 unmetered spaces)
- C. 22nd Street north side, from Iowa Street to 100 feet easterly (restores 5 unmetered spaces)

ESTABLISH – BUS ZONE

22nd Street, north side, from 8 feet to 88 feet west of Iowa Street (for an 80-foot long bus zone)

22nd Street, south side, from 8 feet to 108 feet west of Iowa Street (for a 100-foot long bus zone)

ESTABLISH – BIKE ROUTE

22nd Street, eastbound and westbound, between Pennsylvania Street and Illinois Street (Class III bike facility with sharrows)

RESCIND – BUS FLAG STOP

22nd Street, south side, east of Minnesota Street

ESTABLISH - BUS FLAG STOP

22nd Street, south side, west of Minnesota Street

ESTABLISH - NO PARKING ANYTIME ESTABLISH - SIDEWALK WIDENING

- A. 22nd Street, north side, from Pennsylvania Street to 31 feet westerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes two unmetered spaces)
- B. 22nd Street, south side, from Pennsylvania Street to 75 feet easterly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out in rescinded bus zone)
- C. 22nd Street, north side, from Minnesota Street to 39 feet westerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes two unmetered spaces; existing fire hydrant red zone)
- D. 22nd Street, north side, from Tennessee Street to 37 feet easterly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes one unmetered space; one existing red zone)
- E. 22nd Street, south side, from Tennessee Street to 40 feet westerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes two unmetered spaces)
- F. 22nd Street, north side, from 3rd Street to 28 feet westerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes one unmetered parking space)
- G. 22nd Street, south side, from 3rd Street to 31 feet westerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes two unmetered parking spaces)
- H. 22nd Street, north side, from 3rd Street to 40 feet easterly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes two unmetered parking spaces)
- I. 22nd Street, south side, from 3rd Street to 25 feet easterly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes one unmetered parking space)
- J. 3rd Street, west side, from 22nd Street to 23 feet northerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes one unmetered parking space)
- K. 3rd Street, west side, from 22nd Street to 23 feet southerly (for a 6-foot wide bulb-out; removes one unmetered parking space)

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<u>ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING, PART TIME BUS ZONE, 6 AM TO 10 AM AND 3 PM TO 4 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY</u>

Geary Boulevard, north side, from 29th Avenue to 120 feet westerly (Muni zone replaces six parking spaces for one additional hour per weekday from 3pm-4pm)

RESCIND – BUS ZONE

3rd Street, east side, from Stillman Street to Perry Street (138-foot bus zone to be replaced by three general metered spaces and three yellow metered parking spaces)

<u>ESTABLISH – YELLOW METERED LOADING ZONE, 9 AM TO 4 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY</u>

3rd Street, east side, from Stillman Street to 66 feet northerly (three yellow metered loading zones partially replace 138-foot bus zone)

ESTABLISH – BUS ZONE

3rd Street, east side, from Bryant Street to Stillman Street (154-foot bus zone to replace yellow metered parking spaces 447, 449 and 451; and metered spaces 457, 459, 461)

RESCIND - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING, AREA G, 2 HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA G PERMIT

Franklin Street, east side, between California Street and Pine Street

<u>ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING, AREA G, 2 HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA G PERMIT</u>

Franklin Street, west side, between California Street and Pine Street

<u>ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 2-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY</u>

Franklin Street, east side, between California Street and Pine Street (establishes up to 10 full-sized metered parking spaces)

Commuter Shuttle Program

SFMTA Engineering Public Hearing Friday, January 6, 2017, 10am • City Hall Room 416 (Hearing Room 4)

The SFMTA is proposing to extend the length and hours of the existing commuter shuttle zone at 16th Street and South Van Ness Avenue. The proposal would:

- Extend the shuttle loading zone by 44 feet
- Extend the evening hours of the zone to 11pm

The changes would restrict parking at two additional spaces 6-10am and 4-11pm, Monday-Friday. They would also extend the parking restriction in the existing zone by three hours to 11pm, Monday-Friday.

Why is the SFMTA proposing this change?

These changes would reduce shuttles' impact on Muni and traffic by providing sufficient room for them to pull out of the travel lane while loading. Currently, shuttles often are not able to pull to the curb to load and unload, particularly after 8pm.

What is the Commuter Shuttle Program?

The Commuter Shuttle Program provides permitted employer-operated shuttles access to a limited network of Muni and white zones when shuttle operators meet a number of requirements, including:

- Driver safety training
- Stringent vehicle emissions standards
- Limiting larger shuttles to arterial streets
- Labor harmony
- Compliance with all state and local regulations
- Per-stop fees that pay for enforcement, program administration, and capital improvements
