

 - need to evaluate the program and identify policy & administrative improvements
 - FHWA grant awarded to support this work
- Area Q planning (2014-2015) elevated some issues
 - easier access to short-term permits
 - modified pricing for motorcycles
 - business permit changes
 - parking for visitors




Project Timeline






Residential Permit Parking Areas






Research Highlights: Permit Issuance

Early Accomplishments

- Allowance for electric mopeds
- Launched on-line RPP petition
- Tailor to neighborhood context
- Completed parking occupancy survey
- Compiled data & aggregated by Area
- Developed citywide household survey
