Project Goals

- 1. Improve safety through the Alemany Boulevard/ US 101/ I-280 interchange
- 2. Better connect neighborhoods and Alemany Farmers Market separated by freeways



3. Low-cost improvements delivered quickly



Proposed Improvements

- Protected bike lanes on Alemany Boulevard
- New bike path at Alemany Boulevard/ Bayshore Boulevard intersection
- Buffered bike lanes on San Bruno Avenue and Putnam Street southbound
- High-Visibility crosswalk markings
- Striped edgelines



Outreach



Planning Phase:

Eight community meetings and workshops Oct 2015 – Nov 2016
Interactive Project booth at Alemany Farmers Market twice
Outreach through community orgs, email, website and social media

San Bruno Bike Lane addition:

Targeted outreach to people living and working along San Bruno Ave.

Staff went door-to-door with flyers and emailed neighborhood groups

Special public hearing held May 2018, notices posted along San Bruno.







Legislation Phase:

Illustrated notices posted in both English and Chinese in addition to standard SFMTA Board Hearing notices


Alemany Boulevard






Alemany/Bayshore Intersection

Vehicle Traffic Changes

Alemany Boulevard:

- Protected bike lanes replace one travel lane in each direction
- Traffic signal timings will be adjusted to minimize traffic delays
- No Turn on Red on two legs of the Alemany Blvd/Bayshore Blvd intersection to accommodate two-stage bicycle turn queue boxes


San Bruno Avenue:

- Wide lanes are narrowed to make room for southbound bike lane
- No changes to Muni Bus Route 8 operations (northbound only)

Parking: No changes
