ACCESSIBLE MEETING POLICY

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors/Parking Authority Commission meeting will be held in Room 400, at 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place (400 Van Ness Ave.), San Francisco, CA. The closest accessible BART station is the Civic Center Station at United Nations Plaza and Market Street. Accessible Muni transit serving this location are: Muni Metro lines J-Church, K-Ingleside, L Taraval, M Ocean View, N Judah and T Third at Van Ness and Civic Center Stations; F Market-Wharves; 19 Polk, 47 Van Ness; 49 Mission-Van Ness; 5 Fulton; 5R Fulton; 6 Haight-Parnassus, 7 Haight-Noriega 7R Haight-Noriega; 21-Hayes; 9 San Bruno; 9R San Bruno Rapid and 71 Haight-Noriega. The meeting room is wheelchair accessible. Accessible curbside parking spaces have been designated on the Van Ness Avenue and McAllister Street perimeters of City Hall for people with mobility impairments. There is accessible parking available within the underground Civic Center Garage at the corner of McAllister and Polk streets and within the Performing Arts Garage at Grove and Franklin streets.

CONSENT CALENDAR

- 10. All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors and will be acted upon by a single vote. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a member of the Board of Directors or the public so requests, in which event the matter shall be removed from the Consent Calendar and considered as a separate item.
- (10.1) Requesting the Controller to allot funds and to draw warrants against such funds available or will be available in payment of the following claims against the SFMTA:

- A. Debera Taylor vs. CCSF, Citylaw No. 190703 settled on 8/7/19 for \$30,000. (Explanatory documents include a resolution.)
- (10.2) Approving the following traffic modifications:
 - A. ESTABLISH RED ZONE Washington Street, south side, from Mason Street to 30 feet easterly.
 - B. ESTABLISH RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA S ESTABLISH 2-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 9 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA S PERMITS; Dolores Street, east side, between 19th Street and Cumberland Street.
 - C. ESTABLISH 15 MILES PER HOUR SCHOOL SPEED LIMIT WHEN CHILDREN ARE PRESENT Golden Gate Avenue, between Hyde Street and Leavenworth Street; Golden Gate Avenue, between Leavenworth Street and Jones Street
 - D. ESTABLISH 25 MILES PER HOUR SCHOOL SPEED LIMIT WHEN CHILDREN ARE PRESENT Visitacion Avenue, between Mansell Street and Hahn Street.
 - E. ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME Harrison Street, south side, from Spear Street to 29 feet easterly, and making environmental review findings. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution. For every parking and traffic modification that received a categorical exemption, the proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.)
- (10.3) Authorizing the Director to execute Modification No. 1 to Contract No. 1260R, Muni Metro System Integrated Systems Replacement Project, with Blocka Construction to compensate the Contractor for costs associated with SFMTA delays, additional work, and procurement of hardware, increasing the Contract amount by \$1,509,166.24, for a total Contract amount not to exceed \$25,625,166.24, and an extension of time to substantial completion of 1,440 days. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution and modification.)
- (10.4) Authorizing the Director to execute an industrial gross lease between Infoimage of California, as landlord, and the SFMTA, as tenant, for 890 Pennsylvania Avenue for the Transit Division's Track Department at an estimated rent and operating expense amount of \$3,374,118 for seven years. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution and lease.)

Authorizing the Director to execute Contract No. 2018-48 Armed and Unarmed Security Guard Services with Universal Protection Service, dba Allied Universal Security Services, to act as a first deterrent for inappropriate activity, ensure the safety of personnel, protect property and the public, and guard against vandalism, in an amount not to exceed \$59,028,401 for a three-year term, with three options to extend the Contract for one year each. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution, and contract.)
- 15. Approving the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency's Fiscal Year 2019 2030 Short Range Transit Plan. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution, and plan.)
- 16. Approving a Contract Approval Delegation and Requirements Policy which delegates to the Director of Transportation the authority to approve and execute expenditure and revenue contracts, contract amendments, and other agreements within certain limits. (Explanatory documents include a staff report, resolution, and policy.)

ADJOURN

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

<u>Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions</u>: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
