The <u>Page Street Bikeway Improvements Pilot</u> is a 12-month pilot of temporary traffic restrictions and bikeway improvements installed on **Page Street between Webster and Gough streets** in March 2020.

Project Information: Project elements include reducing car traffic and conflicts, an uphill bike lane and protected downhill bike lane, and supporting transit on Haight St



In response to COVID-19, SFMTA developed the <u>Slow Streets Program</u> to limit through traffic on certain residential streets - including **Page Street between Webster and Stanyan streets** to allow social distancing for essential trips on foot and by bike.

The Page Street Slow Street between Stanyan and Webster streets **is distinct and separate** from the Page Street Bikeway Improvements Pilot Project. More information about the Slow Streets Program is available at https://www.sfmta.com/projects/slow-streets-program.

Since the Central Freeway was removed in 2005, Page Street became a conduit for freeway-bound traffic (including spillover from Oak Street), creating safety issues for people walking/bicycling and adversely affecting the quality of life for neighbors.

Using temporary materials such as paint, posts, and signage, the pilot limits vehicle through traffic on Page Street between Webster and Gough streets to local vehicle traffic only.


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
