

Golden Gate Avenue Quick-Build Project

Construction of the Golden Gate Avenue Quick-Build is substantially complete!

The project spans from Market Street to Polk Street and implementation included parking removal and reallocation in order to upgrade the existing bike lane and protect people walking and biking from moving traffic. This newly protected bikeway helps people riding bikes connect to Polk Street and Market Street, which are important links in the overall city bicycle network.

Community partners, specifically Code Tenderloin and TLCBD's Safe Passage, supported MTA staff during construction by accompanying them on site visits and assisting with outreach and notification.


Leavenworth Street Quick-Build Project

Construction for the Leavenworth Quick-Build Project started this month and will be completed in the coming weeks.

Spanning from McAllister Street to Post Street, the Leavenworth Street Quick-Build design includes a road diet with narrow buffers on both sides of the roadway, pedestrian safety improvements such as crosswalks and painted safety zones, and reallocated curb space for residents' and businesses' parking and loading needs. These improvements were informed by community comments, and the SFMTA will continue working with the community to explore future use of the buffer space.

Evans Avenue Quick-Build Project

The Evans Avenue Quick-Build Project is an effort to improve traffic safety conditions and comfort for all who travel along Evans Avenue between Cesar Chavez and 3rd Street by using adjustable, quick-to-construct, and reversible roadway treatments.

This segment of Evans Avenue is in the Bayview neighborhood and home to commercial retail, light and heavy industrial, and city department activities. There are six new developments along the corridor either planned, under construction or recently opened.

In addition to increased activity within the area, Evans Avenue is part of the Vision Zero High Injury Network. From 2015 to 2020, 81 traffic collisions have been reported along this corridor. Improvements within the project area will increase safety for all users of Evans Avenue whether they drive, walk, bike, or ride Muni and support the City's Vision Zero commitment.

In April and May 2021, the SFMTA distributed surveys and collected input on several proposed design concepts. After the survey period, the project team will review the feedback received to fine tune a preferred design. The design will be finalized later in the summer and shared with the public.
