PUBLIC COMMENT (ConnectSF):

David Pilpel disagreed with the future demand projections and shared that the SFMTA should maintain existing assets, and make the transportation system and agency leaner and more effective.

Herbert Weiner asked how seniors and the disabled fit into the work being done and urged the SFMTA to restore service to pre-COVID levels.

PUBLIC COMMENT (SFMTA 20-year Capital Plan):

David Pilpel suggested the SFMTA make a commitment to asset management and proposed that once the SFMTA is in a better place with existing asset maintenance, then discuss enhancement and expansion.

PUBLIC COMMENT (Transportation 2050):

Herbert Weiner questioned how seniors and the disabled fit into the plan and whether they were considered.

David Pilpel expressed concern over survey questions and survey method and shared his thoughts on development of SFMTA property.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Board of Supervisors review of certain SFMTA Decisions: Certain parking and traffic modifications as well as Private Transportation Programs that involve certain parking modifications can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors. These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
