
Community oversight of grant implementation, meets every 3 months

HOW THE SHUTTLE WORKS

- Reserve a ride through the app or a tri-lingual call center (Spanish, English, Chinese). Rides can be to anywhere within the service area.
- Walk to a "virtual bus stop". This could be your front door, the corner of your street, or one block away.
- **3.** Get picked up by a small shuttle vehicle. Pay a Muni fare with your Clipper Card.
- 4. Shuttle picks-up and dropsoff other passengers along the way to your destination.
