2. <u>Harrison Street, between 1st Street and Fremont Street – Parking Meters</u> RESCIND – 2-HOUR PARKING, 9:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 2-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 9:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

Proposal to revise an existing NO LEFT TURN restriction exemption for Muni, allowing Muni buses to make this turn at other times as needed for the 43 Masonic Muni route.



6. <u>Various Business Districts</u> RESCIND – 25 MPH SPEED LIMIT

ESTABLISH - 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT

- A. Beach Street, between Taylor Street and Polk Street
- B. Larkin Street, between North Point Street and Beach Street
- C. Leavenworth Street, between Beach Street and Jefferson Street
- **D.** Jones Street, between Beach Street and Jefferson Street
- E. Taylor Street, between Bay Street and Jefferson Street
- F. Mason Street, between Beach Street and Jefferson Street
- **G.** Powell Street, between Beach Street and Jefferson Street (Supervisor District 2 and 3) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Jeffrey Tom, jeffrey.tom@sfmta.com

Proposal to implement third phase of AB43 which allowed cities in California to lower speed limits to 20 MPH in designated businesses districts that meet criteria such as at least 50 percent commercial frontage, on-street parking, and four or fewer lanes.

Proposal to install daylighting to improve visibility.



10. Winston Drive and Buckingham Way – Parking Time Limit ESTABLISH – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY

Winston Drive, both sides, from Lake Merced Boulevard to Buckingham Way Buckingham Way, both sides, Unit, 100, 200, and 300 Blocks (Supervisor District 7) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Andy Thornley, andy.thornley@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish weekday daytime parking time limits on Winston Drive to support parking availability for SF State University faculty, students, staff, and visitors.

11. Scott Street at Duboce Avenue – Red Zone ESTABLISH – RED ZONE

Proposal to add 15-foot daylighting red zone to improve visibility for vehicles and pedestrians.

12(a). RESCIND – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY ESTABLISH – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, EXCEPT VEHICLES WITH AREA W PERMITS

Utah Street, east side, from 25th Street to south terminus

12(b). RESCIND – 4-HOUR PARKING, 8:00 AM TO 6:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY
Utah Street, west side, from 25th Street to south terminus
(Supervisor District 9) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Raynell Cooper,

Proposal to establish time limit parking regulation to a currently unregulated block face (west side) and extend RPP permit parking on a block face with a general time limit (east side).

Categorically exempt from Environmental Review: CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 Class 1(c): Operation, repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filling a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
