Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA decision prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Note: The project would be approved by the City Traffic Engineer, and not at a noticed public hearing. Therefore, the Approval Action as defined by San Francisco. Administrative Code Chapter 31, Sections 31.04(h)(2) and 31.08(g) would be posting of the date of approval on the Planning Department website. The Approval Action starts the 30-day exemption appeal period.
