


# Where are Shared Spaces?

#### **Shared Street** vs Slow Street

- 1. Regularly recurring, scheduled block(s) closure
- On commercial corridors to support activation and economic activity
- 3. Closed to all motorized traffic
- 4. Requires **sponsor** and SFMTA permit
- 5. Primary purpose: destination

- 1. Traffic-calmed street, prioritizes active transportation and slow speeds
- Intended for residential streets to support more walking and biking
- 3. Open to all modes of travel
- Requires SFMTA Board Approval
- Primary purpose: mobility

#### **Location Criteria**



Free of public transit or bike lanes



Few driveways or intersecting alleys



Low traffic volumes and slow speeds









No fire or police stations, medical, or similar facilities

Additional analysis may be required to confirm feasibility for locations that don't meet conditions

#### **Hayes Valley Shared St Timeline**

### **Hayes Valley Shared St Location**



#### **Hayes Street Successes**

- Created outdoor space when it wasn't safe to be indoors.
- Neighbors love the additional community gathering space!
- Some businesses report additional foot traffic.





# Hayes Street Challenges (1 / 2)



- Lack of activation
- Inconsistently meeting permit conditions (eg, barricade placement and monitoring intersections)



- Traffic congestion on nearby blocks
- Confusion and disorder for deliveries and customers

Hayes Street Challenges (cont.)

- Double parking at intersection barricades blocks SFFD emergency access.
- Muni passengers and operators impacted by reroute.





#### Permit Stakeholder Engagement

- Staff met with stakeholders representing main HV merchant and neighborhood groups.
- Staff took feedback to develop recommendations that address pandemic challenges and create success.



#### **Post-Pandemic Staff Recommendation**

- 1. Modified Hours-(Every Saturday 1pm-10pm)
- 2. Regular Activation
  - @Shared Spaces Arts & Culture grant program!
- 3. Modified barricades to reduce double parking
- 4. Barricade Monitors
- 5. Additional wayfinding
- 6. Additional passenger loading at Gough and Octavia
- 7. Directions and Parking Map





#### **New Barricade Setup**



Cones outside crosswalk (Gough) and arcshape (Octavia) reduce illegal double parking and loading

# **Shared Street Wayfinding**




#### **More Input: Surveys**

After staff shared the post-pandemic proposal,

- HVNA released a membership survey
  - Overwhelming support from neighbors to keep closure
- Office of Small Business completed door-to-door surveys to merchants directly on the 300, 400, 500 blocks
  - 16% merchants want street closed all weekend
  - 11% merchants want no closure at all
  - 66% preferred or satisfied with a one-day closure (eg Saturdays)

#### **Next Steps**

#### Create success:

- Demonstrate compliance with permit terms
- Find opportunities and partnerships for activation
- Ensure business loading and other needs are met
- Ensure 21-Hayes not impacted
- Collect data
- Improved activation and compliance will increase merchant support

#### Expand upon success:

 We can expand geography and/or hours/days based on merchant discussions and preferences if permit conditions are met
