1. <u>Richardson Avenue at Lyon Street – Red Zone</u> ESTABLISH – RED ZONE

Richardson Avenue, north side, from Lyon Street to 20 feet easterly (curb space between 3234 and 3230 Lyon Street driveways) (Supervisor District 2) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Amy Chun, amy.chun@sfmta.com

Proposal to install daylighting to improve visibility.

2. <u>Felton Street at Bowdoin Street – STOP Signs</u> ESTABLISH – STOP SIGNS

Felton Street, eastbound and westbound, at Bowdoin Street (Supervisor District 9) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Amy Chun, amy.chun@sfmta.com

Proposal to convert this intersection to an all-way STOP to address collisions.

3. <u>Alemany Boulevard at Theresa Street – Tow-Away, No Parking Any Time</u> RESCIND – TOW-AWAY, NO PAKRING ANY TIME

Alemany Boulevard, east side, from Theresa Street to 50 feet southerly Alemany Boulevard, west side, from Theresa Street to 50 feet northerly (Supervisor District 11) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Corbin Skerrit, <u>corbin.skerrit@sfmta.com</u>

Removing 50-foot TANPAT red zones along Alemany Boulevard with the installation of the new traffic signal to allow additional parking. Near-side visibility red zones will be maintained along Alemany Boulevard.

4. <u>Mission Street at 6th Street – Curb Changes</u>

RESCIND – BUS ZONE

Mission Street, north side, from 150 feet to 168 feet west of 6th Street **ESTABLISH – GENERAL LOADING ZONE, 5-MINUTE LIMIT, AT ALL TIMES** Mission Street, north side, from 150 feet to 170 feet west of 6th Street (Supervisor District 6) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Hester Yu, hester.yu@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish a general loading zone for a community center.



5. <u>Grant Avenue at The Embarcadero – No Turn on Red</u> ESTABLISH – NO TURN ON RED

Grant Avenue, northbound, at Beach Street and The Embarcadero (Supervisor District 3) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Dustin White, <u>dustin.white@sfmta.com</u>

Proposal to establish a "No Turn on Red" restriction for northbound Grant Avenue at Beach Street and The Embarcadero to improve safety and transit operations.

Fillmore Street between Chestnut Street and Bay Street RESCIND – TOW AWAY, NO STOPPING, PART-TIME SCHOOL BUS LOADING ZONE, 7 AM-4 PM, SCHOOL DAYS ESTABLISH - TOW AWAY, NO STOPPING, PART-TIME SCHOOL BUS LOADING ZONE, 7 AM-4:30 PM, SCHOOL DAYS Fillmore Street, east side, from 61 feet to 279 feet north of Chestnut Street (Supervisor District 2) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Andre Wright,

This proposal changes the school bus loading zone times to align with the school's schedule.

7. <u>Laguna Street at Hayes Street – On-Street Bicycle Parking</u> ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANY TIME, EXCEPT BICYCLES

Laguna Street, east side, from 5 feet to 15 feet south of Hayes Street (Supervisor District 5) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Carmen Leung, <u>carmen.leung@sfmta.com</u>

Proposal to establish one on-street bicycle corral in the existing red zone at the intersection of Laguna Street and Hayes Street.



ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on <u>SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults</u> by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>.
