Vision Zero Traffic Sign Upgrades and New Turn Restrictions Project

SUMMARY

The project sponsor, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA), proposes to enhance pedestrian safety throughout the city by installing replacement traffic signs and new No Turn on Red restrictions with new accompanying signage.

PROPOSED PROJECT

Traffic Signs Upgrades


To support Vision Zero efforts, the SFMTA is proposing to install replacement NO TURN ON RED, STOP, Speed Limit, NO LEFT/RIGHT TURN, ONE-WAY, and DO NOT ENTER signs that are reaching the end of their useful lives. The replacements would bring signs up to current retroreflective and type standards, improving safety and visibility for all users of the road. Approximately 3,300 signs would be upgraded citywide.

No Turn on Red (NTOR) Restrictions

To additionally support Vision Zero efforts, the SFMTA is proposing to enhance pedestrian safety by installing new NO TURN ON RED restrictions and accompanying signage at approximately 200 signalized intersections. The new restrictions would be focused in the City's downtown North of Market and South of Market core areas where crash concentrations are highest and is a low-cost measure to improve pedestrian safety by keeping crosswalks clear and reducing potential pedestrian collisions at major intersections. Construction

Installation of the improvements would be led by the SFMTA's Sign Shop and anticipated to begin in early 2024 and end in August 2025.


