

Sustainable Streets Division Directive Order No. 6763

Pursuant to the public hearing held on April 19, 2024, traffic movement and safety may be improved by the changes approved below. The Environmental Clearance for these items is noted on Order No. 6755.

1. ESTABLISH – STOP SIGNS

Sea View Terrace, eastbound, at 30th Avenue (Supervisor District 1) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer) Michael Tsai, michael.tsai@sfmta.com

Proposal to stop the stem of the T-intersection to clarify the right-of-way.

Public Comments: No comments.

Decision: Approved by the City Traffic Engineer for implementation. #

2. ESTABLISH – PERPENDICULAR PARKING

Carroll Avenue, south side, from Hawes Street to 85 feet westerly (Supervisor District 10) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Andy Thornley, andy.thornley@sfmta.com

Proposal to establish perpendicular parking on a portion of the south side of the 1300 block of Carroll Avenue, to provide more parking availability for a small business located there.

Public Comments: Received six emails in support prior to public hearing. Comment in support and regarding railroad activity on Carroll received during public hearing.

Decision: Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.

Bosworth Street, north side, from east crosswalk at Lyell Street to 107 feet westerly (Supervisor District 8) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Justin Yuen, justin.yuen@sfmta.com

Proposal to remove parking on the north side of Bosworth Street to accommodate a modification of the existing westbound Class II bike lane on Bosworth Street at Lyell Street.

Eddy Street, south side, from Mason Street to 20 feet westerly (creates 20-foot zone for hydrant and daylighting).

Eddy Street, south side, from 100 feet west of Mason Street to 121 feet westerly (creates 21-foot zone for hydrant).

13(d). RESCIND – YELLOW METER LOADING ZONE, 7AM-6PM, MONDAY THOUGH FRIDAY ESTABLISH – BUS ZONE

This proposal will not affect address-based eligibility for residents or businesses to obtain a RPP permit. Current RPP permit holders will retain their permits and can park on adjacent RPP blocks.

Public Comments: Received five emails in opposition prior to public hearing. Comments in opposition received during public hearing with concerns for parking loss and potential impact to transit due to parking turnover. Suggestion made to repurpose unused parklets on Haight to regular parking space(s).

Decision: Item continued for further review.

- Question raised about how to protest City Traffic Engineer's decision.



Whether or not the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, it is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If the City Traffic Engineer disapproves or declines a parking or traffic modification, a member of the public must request additional review by the SFMTA of that decision which shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code before the decision becomes a Final SFMTA Decision. Final SFMTA Decisions, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>. Decisions reviewable by the Board of Supervisors are denoted with a pound (**#**).
