94% of respondents in the Sanchez Slow Street User Survey live in the neighborhood

What is a Permanent Slow Street?



Time

- Traffic changes would extend beyond State of Emergency
- Authorization not tied to COVID emergency



Materials

- Part of the neighborhood's lasting infrastructure
- Part of the city's overall transportation network
