San Francisco—The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) releases the following upcoming event-related traffic and transit impacts for this weekend, from **Saturday**, **April 23**, **through next Wednesday**, **April 27**, **2022**.

Masks Mandate Update

Following the latest guidance from the <u>California Department of Public Health</u> (CDPH), San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), masks are strongly recommended but no longer required in any SFMTA facilities or vehicles including Muni bus, taxi and paratransit.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the ballpark, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Two and a half hours before the opening pitch, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic. King Street will reopen after first pitch until the seventh inning.
- From the seventh inning until post-game traffic dies down, the SFMTA will again close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period.

Taxi Stands

- 2nd Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2nd Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets
- 3rd Street, east side, north of King Street

Special Event Parking Rates

During baseball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the Oracle Park, **parking meters close to the ballpark will charge a special event rate of \$8 per hour.** These rates help reduce congestion and keep parking spots available in the neighborhoods near the ballpark, discouraging circling for free or cheap parking. <u>UPDATE: Central Subway 4th & King Construction Work</u>

All day, Sunday, April 24, LRV service will be adjusted due to Central Subway construction work at 4th and King. Bus shuttles will provide T Third Bus service between Embarcadero Station and Sunnydale. N Judah and K Ingleside Eastbound will have their last stop at Embarcadero Station. <u>UPDATE: Fix It! Week (Early closures for Muni Subway Maintenance)</u>

Thursday, April 14 through Saturday, April 23 (Fix It! Week): Early subway closures take place from Thursday April 14 to Saturday April 23 to allow for maintenance work. The subway between Embarcadero and West Portal will close early at 9:30 p.m.

During the Fix It! Week, KLM Bus Shuttles run above ground to connect all stops between Third/Mission Rock and Saint Francis Circle. The buses operate begin at 9:30 p.m. through the normal end of train service at midnight. Owl service remains unchanged. Trains start regular morning service each day.

Service during the early shutdowns, 9:30 p.m. to midnight until Saturday, April 23 as follows:

- KLM Bus Shuttle: Serve all Muni Metro stops and Market Street island stops between Third/Mission Rock and St. Francis Circle
- K Ingleside and M Ocean View trains will operate between Balboa Park and St. Francis Circle
- N Judah and J Church trains will operate "interlined" between Balboa Park and Ocean Beach for both directions with a switch at Church/Duboce:
 - o J Church train will continue to Ocean Beach as N Judah
 - o N Judah train will continue on to Balboa Park as J Church
- T Third train will operate between Sunnydale and Third/Mission Rock

For service on Market Street, Muni customers can board KLM bus shuttles at bus stops marked with the half-moon sign.

Accessible transfers to trains will be at boarding island at Church/Market and Church/Duboce.

Current Muni Service:

Effective Saturday, April 16: The 56 Rutland route is extended to provide connection to Burton High School.

Effective Monday, April 18: The 8AX Bayshore A Express and 8BX Bayshore B Express routes will return to service.

The following Muni routes run from 5 a.m. to midnight daily: 1 California, 5 Fulton, 8 Bayshore, 9 San Bruno, 14 Mission, 22 Fillmore, 24 Divisadero, 25 Treasure Island, 28 19th Avenue, 29 Sunset, 30 Stockton, 38 Geary, 43 Masonic, 44 O'Shaughnessy, 48 Quintara/24th Street and 49 Van Ness.

Metro service now runs until midnight daily.

Until further notice, Muni buses will continue to serve the L Taraval Metro line.

<u>UPDATE: L Taraval Improvement Project—Segment B</u>

The SFMTA is leading a multi-agency collaboration with the San Francisco Public Works (SFPW) and the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) to replace and rehabilitate aging infrastructure along Taraval Street. The L Taraval Improvement Project will replace worn rails, overhead wires, water, and sewer lines and repave the entire street along the L Taraval Line, from West Portal to the SF Zoo to make pedestrian crossing safer, increase accessibility and improve transit reliability.

Segment B continues infrastructure work along the L Taraval line between Sunset Boulevard and 15th Avenue, and on Ulloa Street near West Portal.

Upgraded sewer and water lines, permanent boarding islands and increased accessibility are on the way!

Water and sewer work is currently underway. Construction is scheduled to take place from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

ONGOING: Castro Westbound Platform Elevator Closed for Upgrades

The rehabilitation on the westbound platform elevator at Muni Castro Station has begun and will continue for about six months. During this time, the elevator will be closed for upgrades.

The SFMTA is committed to continuously improving safety and reliability for all Muni customers even during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Castro elevator is the eighth of 12 being rehabilitated systemwide as part of the <u>Muni Elevator Improvement Project</u>. The project will greatly improve accessibility and convenience, especially for wheelchair users, seniors, and others with disabilities who benefit from elevator access.

ONGOING: 19th Avenue (CA Route 1) Combined City Project

San Francisco Public Works is leading a multi-agency project to replace aging infrastructure and improve safety along 19th Avenue between Holloway Avenue and Lincoln Way.

Construction work for the first segment of this project along 19th Avenue between Lincoln Way and Noriega Street has begun.

As part of the <u>19th Avenue Combined City Project</u>, the SFMTA will implement transit priority and safety improvements for people walking along the route of the 28 19th Avenue. The improvements will make it safer to walk, remove stops to make transit service more reliable, and enhance customers' experiences—on and off the bus.

To improve safety along 19th Avenue, the SFMTA will: **1)** install pedestrian bulbs at 19 intersections and transit bulbs at 13 intersections; **2)** modify traffic and pedestrian signals to give people who walk more time to cross the street; and **3)** extend the bus zone at one intersection. Installing transit bulbs allow Muni vehicles to stop for passengers without having to pull out of traffic, and pedestrian bulbs increase the visibility at intersections of people who walk.

As part of the project, seven Muni stops were removed on 19th Avenue between Irving Street and Ocean Avenue last October. The following Muni routes have been affected with the stop removal:

- 28 19th Avenue
- 91 3rd Street/19th Avenue Owl

ONGOING: Shared Spaces Program

The city's multi-agency <u>Shared Spaces</u> program opened some parts of streets in San Francisco to create public space for outdoor dining, retail, cultural activities and physical distancing. The program allows the use of sidewalks, parking space, full or partial streets, or other nearby public spaces like parks and plazas for a wide range of activities responding to the COVID pandemic, as allowed by San Francisco's Public Health Order. ONGOING: Essential Trip Card Discount Program

The SFMTA's temporary special program, <u>Essential Trip Card</u> (ETC) Program, will assist people with disabilities and older adults to make essential trips under Muni's temporary transit changes. The program provides two to three round trips at an 80% discount per month, i.e. rider pays \$6 to receive a value of \$30 or pays \$12 to receive a \$60 value. Riders may receive additional value up to \$120 of taxi service per month per customer upon request.

To qualify for the program: customer must be either age 65 or older or an adult with disabilities. Eligible adults may apply for the ETC program by calling 311 and mentioning the program. Staff will be available between 9 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday.
