10. All matters listed hereunder constitute a Consent Calendar, are considered to be routine by the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors and will be acted upon by a single vote. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a

- 10.1. Approving various routine parking and traffic modifications (The Planning Department has found that items A-E are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act [CEQA]. For these parking and traffic modifications that received a categorical exemption, the proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code. Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.):
 - A. ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA C 665 Geary Street.
 - B. ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA A 920 Montgomery Street.
 - C. ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA J 1638-1640 Haight Street.
 - D. RESCIND – 4-HOUR PARKING, 9 AM TO 8 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY EXCEPT AREA Q PERMITS Fell Street, north side, from Divisadero Street to 78 feet west.
 - E. ESTABLISH – 4-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 8 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY Portola Drive, north side, from 138 feet east of Dorchester Way to Kensington Way.

Requesting that the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) apply \$11,534,333 of SFMTA's Fiscal Year 2022-23 Revenue-based State Transit Assistance (STA) to fulfill its obligation to return funds to the MTC to support the implementation of the July 2021 Transit Transformation Action Plan. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)
- 10.3. Adopting a Resolution of Local Support for the programming of \$10,541,132 of Transit Performance Initiative (TPI) funds for the Next Generation Transit Lane and Bus Zone Enforcement Pilot Program, the Third Street Dynamic Traffic Signal Optimization Project, development of the 29 Sunset Phase II Transit Optimization Project, and the Muni Forward Five-Minute Network Corridor Planning Program; and providing assurances that the SFMTA will comply with Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) policies associated with receipt of these funds. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

Authorizing the Director to execute as-needed Contract No. SFMTA-2022-69-FHWA with the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition Education Fund to provide as-needed management and implementation of San Francisco Safe Routes to School's (SF-SRTS) Education, Encouragement, and Experiential programming, collectively known as the SF-SRTS Non-Infrastructure Program, for an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 and an initial term of two years, with an option to extend



the term up to a maximum of four years. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

Approving the SFMTA's participation in an Interagency Cooperation Agreement (ICA) with the Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA) under which the SFMTA will be reimbursed for effort supporting the Downtown Rail Extension project; and authorizing the Director to approve the SFMTA's Annual Scope and Budget for future fiscal years during the term of the ICA. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

Matter involving unlitigated construction contract claims under Municipal Transportation Agency Contract 1289, related to the Van Ness Corridor Transit Improvement Project with SFMTA to pay \$17,535,525.68 (with expected contribution from SFPUC) and SFMTA to release \$6,464,474.32 of retention to contractor.

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
