SAN FRANCISCO MUNICIPAL TRANSPORTATION AGENCY Order # 5132 FOR PUBLIC HEARING

of SAN FRANCISCO

The Sustainable Streets Division of the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency will hold a public hearing on Friday, August 9, 2013, at 10:00 AM, in Room 416 (Hearing Room 4), City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, San Francisco, CA 94102, to consider the following proposals:

- 1(a). <u>RESCIND TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING EXCEPT FEDERAL SERVICE VEHICLES</u> Golden Gate Avenue, north side, from 42 feet to 103 feet east of Polk Street*
- **1(b).** <u>ESTABLISH NO PARKING EXCEPT BICYCLES (FOR BIKE SHARE STATION)</u> Golden Gate Avenue, north side, from 42 feet to 103 feet east of Polk Street*

The above items were environmentally cleared by the Planning Department on May 18, 2012, for information gathering purposes for a pilot project, case number 2011.0620E.

* Items denoted with an asterisk (*) can be given final approval at the public hearing. Otherwise, the SFMTA Board will make the final approval at a later date based on the outcome at the public hearing.

The purpose of traffic engineering hearings for the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) Sustainable Streets Division is for residents to express their concerns regarding the posted parking and traffic changes affecting their streets. At the hearing, the public hearing officer, after reviewing the items and listening to residents, will make a decision as to whether the items are approved or not. Any interested parties are encouraged to attend.
