6. Public Comment

#### PUBLIC COMMENT:

Edward Mason stated that Friday there is a hearing on establishing a joint shared commuter shuttle bus stop with Muni at  $30^{th}$  and Mission streets. In a two hour window between 7am and 9am, there are 60 commuter buses. Muni staff has said that they are going to divert 20% of those buses to new joint shared stop. That indicates there is a proliferation and no cap of the amount of commuter buses in the city. It's time to bring back the hub study or some other alternative. Local decisions for expansion two counties away are having an impact on the neighborhoods in San Francisco.

Kristin Smith presented the item.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT:

Edward Mason inquired if there are trademark infringements with the song title usage. He asked if other transit agencies are doing anything similar. He inquired how success is measured. Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority has a program where they go out to schools and show the children how to ride the system. Etiquette is very important. He asked if this will be incorporated into the rubber tire fleet. There is a need. He asked what the entire etiquette campaign cost.

Mark Ballew inquired how it is determined where shared stops will be placed and how does Muni measure impact of commuter shuttles when adding or taking away stops.

Joan Downey inquired of Proof of Payment (POP) officers give citations for riders putting their feet on the seats, taking up seats with their bags, and other unfavorable rider behaviors. If so, she would like to know the number of citations given for those behaviors in 2017.

Joan Downey asked if there are rules for rider behavior spelled out anywhere and if so, what are they and where can she find them.
