Workshop Series #2: Outreach Report

- Over **130** posters placed (February 5 through 6)
- 6,800 mailers (text in English, Spanish, Chinese, Filipino) were sent to ½ mile radius from Bryant and Mariposa
- Traditional and social media ads were placed in *El Tecolote, Potrero View, Mission Local,* and Facebook





Workshop Series #2: Outreach Report

- Flyering took place in 4 shifts (Saturday, February 16 through Wednesday, February 20)
 - Approximately **375** total flyers were distributed
 - Bilingual outreach ambassadors
 - Flyers with multilingual text
 - Approximately **545** total interactions were made
 - Conversations were held in language, were largely positive, and many people had heard about the upcoming workshops
 - Age range was mostly 20-40 years old

Discussion: Land Use



Asked: "Should there be housing here?"

- 90.48% responded, "Yes."
- Asked to prioritize considerations
- Responses were somewhat evenly split between total units, height range, shadow impacts, and public vs. private financing.

Discussion: Affordability



Asked: "What income ranges should be prioritized here?" 86.79% selected 55% AMI (out of 46 responses)

Asked: "What aspect of affordability is most important to you?" Responses were evenly spread across affordability mix, unit count, unit type, and income levels

Discussion: Transportation



Asked for feedback on TDM strategies for the neighborhood:

- Bicycle access including bicycle parking and bikesharing stations – was the most-mentioned strategy.
- Parking mentioned several times, in contrast to SFMTA policy.
