- Provided update on 22 Fillmore project which will have a new route to 3<sup>rd</sup> street in Mission Bay
- Project has been occurring for multiple years
- Recommendation to improve signals on 16<sup>th</sup> street between De Haro and Mississippi
- Recommendation to have SMFTA give briefing on 55 line at Mission Bay Citizens Advisory Committee Meeting

# 8. Walk San Francisco Presentation

- Jodie Medeiros, Walk SF Executive Director
- Walk SF has been around since 1998
- 25% of all trips in SF are walking trips
  - But everyone is a pedestrian
- Traffic fatalities are a public health epidemic
- Have not seen a major decrease in severe injuries year after year
  - o 2015-2017 higher than 2011-2014
- Vision Zero Task Force meeting next week
  - Let's speak in one voice to try to get these numbers down
- 75% of injury crashes happen on 13% of SF's streets
- Low-income, immigrants, communities of color, seniors, and people with disabilities are 2X more likely to live on a high injury corridor
- Focus on engineering safe systems approach
- Speed management is key!
- Coming together is important to get to zero
- Walk SF's Strategic Plan 2018-2021
  - Long-term outcomes
    - No pedestrian deaths or injuries
    - Higher walking mode share
  - Interim outcomes
    - More funding
    - More public awareness/outreach
- Make sure to have fun and get excited about walking!
  - Walking is a wonderful way to see this city
- 2019 Priorities: Campaigns, Programs, State Legislation, Funding
- Walking must be recognized as a critical mode of transportation

    - Recommendation to have evening meetings
  - o Held quarterly
