- · Better tree selection and pedestrian friendly installations

6th Street : Proposed Design





- 6th Street Road Diet Market to Howard (Reduce to one travel lane in each direction see draft attachments)
 - New curb alignment with bulbouts
 - Raised crossings at alleyways
 - Raised crossings at intersections
 - Bike Lanes
 - Bikes off sidewalks
 - Emergency vehicles: Room to maneuver around stopped traffic, decreasing response time.
 - Installing bike lanes reduces collision rates overall
 - Bike lanes narrow travel lanes and reduce traffic speeds.
 - Separation from traffic increasing comfort and safety.
 - Aid in crossing by providing a buffer from first traffic lane.
 - Traffic diversion
 - Right turn pockets
 - How to balance diverted vehicles (ideas)
 - Hyde/8th
 - 7th/Leavenworth
