#### 6. SF Police Department Report

Inspector Catigan SFPD

- 3 cases
  - 10/31 3:30 pm South Van Ness and 19<sup>th</sup> Ped was walking and hit by vehicle, driver has been charged
  - $\circ~$  11/2 16  $^{th}$  and De Haro Ped was in crosswalk and struck, driver has been cited
    - Failure to yield to ped in crosswalk
  - 11/12 3<sup>rd</sup> and Underwood Ped in motorized wheelchair struck by Muni train
    - Victim is stable, non-life-threatening injuries
  - 26 fatalities in the city in 2019, 16 for peds, 9 for motor vehicles, 1 bike
    - 26 considered for Vision Zero cases

7. Resolution – Setting maximum speed limits to 20 mph citywide

Jon Winston, SFUSD

- Resolution to reduce the default speed limit to twenty miles per hour on all San Francisco streets where the speed limit is not posted
- Amendment: Remove whereas regarding AB 2363 section

  - $\circ$  Fastest, most effective way to save lives  $\rightarrow$  reducing speeds in SF

# 9. Proposed Resolution – Requesting Transit First pedestrian signs at all transit stops

Howard Strassner, Transit or Environmental

- Melbourne Australia and Memphis Tennessee have transit first signage
- Would like to urge SFMTA to provide similar signage and that transit educational materials be provided to SFUSD
- Concerns on wording of resolution
  - For example, "scurrying" pedestrians and "slowly sauntering"
- Concerns on process for review of resolution
  - Can send Howard comments/amendments ahead of time

#### Public Comment

- John Paar
  - o Lives in the Outer Sunset
  - Wife stepped off light rail and walked into street while Toyota Corolla was passing
  - Street corner of 31<sup>st</sup> and Judah
  - Has been advocating for changes at SFMTA for 1 year
  - SFMTA has re-painted the pedestrian walkways
  - Asking for:
    - Capital budget allocation (\$15M)
    - City should build a proper elevated platform for the light rail
    - Help in getting this in front SFMTA and the Mayor
  - Has met with Supervisor Gordan Mar twice regarding this issue
- Will table this resolution for a future meeting which will include additional amendments

- Two fatality response updates
  - 19<sup>th</sup> and South Van Ness Police investigation still ongoing
    - Engineering team has taken feedback
    - Added 20-foot daylighting zone
    - Retimed signals to reduce traffic speeds
  - $\circ$  16<sup>th</sup> and De Haro
    - Rapid response team went to scene
    - Adding leading pedestrian interval
- 5<sup>th</sup> street quick build
  - Striping is underway
  - o Add daylighting at intersections
  - 1 protected intersection
- Reiterate world day of remembrance for traffic victims 2019
  - $\circ$  4<sup>th</sup> annual event
  - Honor loved ones lost to traffic collisions
  - o 11/17, 3 pm, SF City Hall
- Vision Zero Quarterly Task Force meeting
  - 12/11, 10 am to 12 pm
