Federal Law Requires Face Masks on Muni

To help stop the spread of COVID-19, <u>federal law requires wearing a mask</u> in Muni stations and while riding transit. Violations can result in denial of boarding or removal from Muni and may carry federal penalties. Face coverings like scarves and bandanas do not meet this requirement. Under guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, taxi drivers are required to wear a face covering while transporting passengers. • Three games against the New York Mets: 1) 6:45 p.m., Monday, Aug. 16; 2) 6:45 p.m., Tuesday, Aug. 17; and 3) 12:45 p.m., Wednesday, Aug. 18.

Street Closures

To accommodate events that will take place at the ballpark, the following street closures will be enforced:

- Two and a half hours before the opening pitch, the SFMTA will close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic. This change is to accommodate social distancing for fans entering the ballpark. King Street will reopen after first pitch until the seventh inning.
- From the seventh inning until post-game traffic dies down, the SFMTA will again close eastbound King Street between 3rd and 2nd streets to vehicle traffic in order to reduce congestion on city streets.
- Additionally, the northbound portion of the 4th Street Bridge (Peter R. Maloney Bridge) will be closed to all traffic except Muni, taxis and bicycles during the post-game period.

Taxi Stands

- 2nd Street, west side, between Brannan and King Streets
- 2nd Street, east side, between Townsend and King Streets
- 3rd Street, east side, north of King Street

Special Event Parking Rates

During baseball games and other major events with more than 10,000 expected attendees at the Oracle Park, parking meters close to the ballpark will charge a special event rate of \$8 per hour. These rates help make more parking spots available in South Beach and Mission Bay and help reduce congestion by discouraging circling for free or cheap parking near the ballpark.

Parking meters in the Special Event Zone will operate with a \$8 per hour Special Event rate during baseball games, and meters near the ballpark will be enforced in evenings, and on Sunday during games. Start times for the Special Event rate vary based on game start time. More information on special event parking regulations can be found on www.sfmta.com/special-event-parking.

Low Rider 40th Anniversary Event

Saturday, Aug. 14: The San Francisco Low Rider Council will be conducting a 40th Anniversary cruise and celebration from 2 to 10 p.m. Event will take place on Mission Street between 23rd and 26th streets; and on 24th Street from Osage Street to South Van Ness Avenue.

Travelers heading the event area should allow extra travel time, should expect heavy traffic and possible street closures around the event area during the event hours:

- Mission Street between 22nd Street and Cesar Chavez
- 24th Street between Valencia Street and South Van Ness Avenue

These Muni routes may be impacted: 14 Mission; 14 Mission Rapid; 27 Bryant; 48 Quintara/24th Streets; 49 Van Ness/Mission; and 67 Bernal Heights. Buses running along Mission Street will be rerouted on South Van Ness Avenue. Reroute from 24th Street will be on Cesar Chavez. Muni customers can seek reroute buses on South Van Ness Avenue or Cesar Chavez during event hours.

Escape From Alcatraz Triathlon

Sunday, August 15: The 40th annual "Escape from Alcatraz" Triathlon will begin at 7:30 a.m. with a swim from a barge off Alcatraz into the beach next to the St. Francis Yacht Club. For event details visit www.escapealcatraztri.com.

Bike riders will leave Marina Green, then bike into the Presidio to the Great Highway through Golden Gate Park and back to the Marina for the run to Baker Beach and back to the finish line on Marina Green.

The northernmost lanes of Marina Boulevard between Scott and Lyon streets will be closed between 5:30 a.m. and 1 p.m.

Note: Marina Boulevard will be open for both eastbound and westbound traffic with an exception of one lane closure in each direction.

The route of the bicycle portion of the triathlon will be as follows: from Marina Green into the Presidio to Legion of Honor Drive, right on Clement to Great Highway, through Golden Gate Park via Martin Luther King, Jr. Drive to Transverse, and return via John F. Kennedy Drive on the same route to Marina Green.



Escape From Alcatraz Triathlon continued

The entire bike route will be heavily monitored by San Francisco Police Department personnel, SFMTA Parking Control Officers and race officials. Traffic will be slow in the affected areas and motorists may be delayed as the race passes.

The route of the running portion of the triathlon will be as follows: from Marina Green into the Presidio, down to Baker Beach and back to the finish line on the Marina Green.

The following Muni routes will be affected by the triathlon: 18 46th Avenue; 29 Sunset; 30 Stockton; 38 Geary and 38R Geary Rapid.

UPDATE: Van Ness Improvement Project

On Friday, Aug. 13, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to work on traffic improvements, remaining overhead power installations, traffic signal wiring and hardware installations, light pole setting and related work at the following locations:

- Van Ness between McAllister and Grove streets
- Van Ness between Fell and Market streets
- Van Ness between Market and Mission streets

On **Sunday, Aug. 15**, between the hours of 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., crews are scheduled to work on traffic improvements, remaining overhead power installations, traffic signal wiring & hardware installations, light pole setting, and related work at the following location:

• Van Ness between Market and Mission streets

Work that requires reducing Van Ness Avenue to one lane in each direction will be limited to nighttime hours. UPDATE: Muni's COVID-19 Core Service Network

Some Muni routes have been modified as a result of COVID-19 pandemic restrictions and the city's former health order. The SFMTA plans to make the next COVID-19 Core Service changes on Saturday, Aug. 14 and will begin to normalize the Muni transit system in 2022. Routes Returning, Modified, or Extended: M Ocean View, 5 Fulton, 5 Fulton Owl, 12 Folsom, 18 46th Avenue, 23 Monterey, 28 19th Avenue, 31 Balboa, 35 Eureka, 36 Teresita, 39 Coit, 48 Quintara/24th Street, 48 Quintara Owl, 52 Excelsior, 56 Rutland, 57 Parkmerced, 58 Lake Merced (NEW), 66 Quintara.

Extended Service Hours (5 a.m. to Midnight): 1 California, 8 Bayshore, 9 San Bruno, 14 Mission, 22 Fillmore, 24 Divisadero, 25 Treasure Island, 29 Sunset, 30 Stockton, 38 Geary, 43 Masonic, 44 O'shaughnessy, 49 Van Ness.

Owl network service hours will be changed to approximately midnight to 5 a.m. daily except on the L Owl. The L Owl to Fisherman's Wharf will begin at 10 p.m. and end at 5 a.m. daily.

Service hours for all other routes will generally be from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily, but may vary between weekday and weekend. Please refer to specific route pages for more details.

Until further notice, Muni buses will continue to serve the L Taraval Metro line.

- Owl routes start at 10 p.m. (instead of 1 a.m.) All regular Owl routes are in operation, except 5 Fulton and 48 Quintara/24th Street.
- The following routes are running 24 hours a day or providing special Owl Service: L Owl; N Owl; 14 Mission; 22 Fillmore; 24 Divisadero; 25 Treasure Island; 38 Geary; 44 O'Shaughnessy; 90 San Bruno Owl; 91 3rd Street/19th Avenue Owl.

UPDATE: Shared Spaces Program

The city's multi-agency <u>Shared Spaces</u> program opened some parts of streets in San Francisco to create public space for outdoor dining, retail and physical distancing. The program allows the use of sidewalks, full or partial streets, or other nearby public spaces like parks and plazas for restaurant pick-up and other neighborhood retail activity, as allowed by San Francisco's Public Health Order. The last Sunday closure for shared spaces on Folsom Street between 7th and 8th streets on Sunday, Aug. 15 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Re-routes of the 12 Folsom/Pacific and 27 Bryant Muni routes will be required during the closure hours.

ONGOING: 19th Avenue (CA Route 1) Combined City Project

San Francisco Public Works is leading a multi-agency project to replace aging infrastructure and improve safety along 19th Avenue between Holloway Avenue and Lincoln Way.

Construction work for the first segment of this project along 19th Avenue between Lincoln Way and Noriega Street has begun.

As part of the <u>19th Avenue Combined City Project</u>, the SFMTA will implement transit priority and safety improvements for people walking along the route of the 28 19th Avenue. The improvements will make it safer to walk, remove stops to make transit service more reliable, and enhance customers' experiences—on and off the bus.

To improve safety along 19th Avenue, the SFMTA will: **1)** install pedestrian bulbs at 19 intersections and transit bulbs at 13 intersections; **2)** modify traffic and pedestrian signals to give people who walk more time to cross the street; and **3)** extend the bus zone at one intersection. Installing transit bulbs allow Muni vehicles to stop for passengers without having to pull out of traffic, and pedestrian bulbs increase the visibility at intersections of people who walk.

As part of the project, seven Muni stops were removed on 19th Avenue between Irving Street and Ocean Avenue on Oct. 17, 2020. **The following Muni routes have been affected with the stop removal:**

- 28 19th Avenue
- 91 3rd Street/19th Avenue Owl

ONGOING: Essential Trip Card Discount Program

The SFMTA's temporary special program, <u>Essential Trip Card</u> (ETC) Program, will assist people with disabilities and older adults to make essential trips under Muni's temporary transit changes. The program provides two to three round trips at an 80% discount per month, i.e. rider pays \$6 to receive a value of \$30 or pays \$12 to receive a \$60 value. Riders may receive additional value up to \$120 of taxi service per month per customer upon request.

To qualify for the program: customer must be either age 65 or older or an adult with disabilities. Eligible adults may apply for the ETC program by calling 311 and mentioning the program. Staff will be available between 9 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday.
