The Minna-Natoma Art Corridor Project adds pedestrian and streetscape improvements along Minna and Natoma alleys between 2nd Street and 3rd Street, including a new traffic signal at Natoma Street/New Montgomery Street, sidewalk bulbs, raised crosswalks, a speed table/raised roadway section, decorative paving, pedestrian-scale lighting and public art.

**Public Comments:** Received multiple emails prior to public hearing in support. Received several comments in support during public hearing. Received comments in opposition citing concerns about traffic flow and congestion. Suggestions made to consider shortening the effective hours of the proposed No Turn on Red restriction and flashing the traffic signals overnight. Question raised about HAWK beacon vs. traffic signal.

**Decision:** Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.

# **GENERAL COMMENTS:**

- General discontent with establishment of traffic regulations, restricting drivers from freely navigating the City.
- No Turn on Red restrictions in Tenderloin cause people to break traffic laws.
- Suggestion made to group Traffic Calming items together on the agenda based on location.

Whether or not the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, it is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If the City Traffic Engineer disapproves or declines a parking or traffic modification, a member of the public must request additional review by the SFMTA of that decision which shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code before the decision becomes a Final SFMTA Decision. Final SFMTA Decisions, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>. Decisions reviewable by the Board of Supervisors are denoted with a pound (**#**).
