- C. ESTABLISH NO PARKING ANYTIME Sansome Street, west side, from Broadway to 26 feet southerly.

- V. ESTABLISH TOW-AWAY NO STOPPING ANYTIME Hyde Street, west side, from Jefferson Street to 20 feet southerly; and Hyde Street, east side, from Beach Street to 161 feet northerly.
