- 10.1. Requesting the Controller to allot funds and to draw warrants against such funds available or will be available in payment of the following claims against the SFMTA (Explanatory documents include a resolution):
 - A. Gwendolyn Mitchell v. CCSF, Superior Ct. Case No. CGC-20-584388 filed 05/08/2020 for \$20,000. Lawsuit involving allegations of personal injury from operator negligence (revenue vehicle and passenger).
 - B. Jeannie Quan, Unlitigated Claim No. 23-01884 filed 04/04/2023 for \$25,627.85. Claim involving allegations of property damage from operator negligence (non-revenue vehicle and claimant vehicle).
 - C. Maureen Ferrel v. CCSF, Superior Ct. Case No. CGC-22-599715 filed 05/19/2022 for \$75,000. Lawsuit involving allegations of personal injury from dangerous condition of public property (pedestrian and track area/crosswalk).
- 10.2. Authorizing the Director to execute Master Agreements with Star Elevator Inc., Kone Inc., Schindler Elevator Corporation and TK Elevator Corporation for the maintenance of elevators and escalators in the Muni Metro System and at various SFMTA facilities for a period not to exceed five years from August 15, 2023 through August 14, 2028, in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 for each agreement. (The proposed action is the Approval Action as defined by Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code. Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

Authorizing the Director to execute Contract Modification No. 1 to Contract No. 1316, Woods Facility Rehabilitation Electric Bus Charging Station Pilot Program, with Liffey Electric, Inc., to close out the contract by extending the contract term and adjusting the quantity in the Schedule of Bid Prices to reflect the actual quantity of work performed. This Modification decreases the Contract amount by \$63.71, for a total Contract amount of \$2,693,936.29 and increases the overall Contract Time to substantial completion by 219 days for a total Contract Time of 489 days to Substantial Completion. (Explanatory documents include a staff report and resolution.)

Amending the Transportation Code, Division II, Section 702 to reduce speed limits from 25 miles per hour to 20 miles per hour on the following 23 City street segments: Beach Street, between Taylor Street and Polk Street; Broadway, between Montgomery Street and Powell Street; Bush Street, between Montgomery Street and Grant Avenue; Clay Street, between Montgomery Street and Stockton Street; Cyril Magnin Street, between Market Street and O'Farrell Street; Eddy Street, between Cyril Magnin Street and Mason Street; Ellis Street, between Market Street and Powell Street; Jackson

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under S.F. Admin. Code Chapter 31: For identified Approval Actions, the Planning Department or the SFMTA has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at the Planning Department's website. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA Board, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16 which is typically within 30 calendar days. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or submitted in writing to the City prior to or at such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

These decisions are subject to review within 30 calendar days after they are made by the SFMTA Board of Directors.
