

Sustainable Streets Division Directive Order No. 6706

Pursuant to the public hearing held on October 20, 2023, traffic movement and safety may be improved by the changes approved below. The Environmental Clearance for these items is noted on Order No. 6699.

1. ESTABLISH – RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT AREA J (Eligibility only, no signs)

1626-1636 Haight (Supervisor District 5) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Lulu Brien, lulu.brien@sfmta.com

Extending RPP Area J to this building facing restricted street parking will allow the occupants to purchase parking permits for their vehicle to park within Area J

2. ESTABLISH - RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA Y (Eligibility only, no signs)

This proposal changes current RPP regulation from two-hour parking, Monday through Saturday, 8 AM to 10 PM to two-hour parking, Monday through Friday, 8 AM to 6 PM on both sides of the 200 block of Missouri Street to conform with the existing regulations on other blocks of Missouri Street in RPP Area X

Officially legislating Area Z eligibility on a block that already has eligibility due to a clerical error and adding regulations along with it.

SFMTA recommends stopping the stem of this "T" intersection to better clarify the right- of-way.

Jones Street, east side, from 25 feet to 88 feet north of McAllister Street (removes 3 spaces) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer)

16(b). ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME

Jones Street, east side, from McAllister Street to 88 feet northerly (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board)

16(c). ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING, 10 PM TO 7 AM, DAILY

Jones Street, east side, from 88 feet north of McAllister Street to Golden Gate Avenue (Supervisor District 5) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Edward Tang, edward.tang@sfmta.com

Proposal to remove general metered parking and establish a tow-away zone at the request of San Francisco Police Department to deter criminal activity.

Public Comments: Comment suggesting changing passenger loading zone hours and to consider "NO PARKING" instead of "NO STOPPING" restrictions.

Decision: Approved by the City Traffic Engineer to forward to the SFMTA Board for final approval and implementation.



17(a). RESCIND – GENERAL METERED PARKING, 2-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 7 AM to 6 PM, MONDAY TRHOUGH SATURDAY

A. Fulton Street, north side, from 21.5 feet to 115 feet east of Larkin Street (removes 11 spaces)

B. Fulton Street, south side, from 14 feet to 124.5 feet east of Larkin Street (removes 13 spaces)

C. Fulton Street, north side, from 17.5 feet to 102.5 feet west of Hyde Street (removes 10 spaces)

D. Fulton Street, south side, from 21 feet to 106 feet west of Hyde Street (removes 10 spaces) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board)

17(b). RESCIND – GENERAL MOTORCYCLE PARKING, 10-HOUR TIME LIMIT, 7 AM to 6 PM, MONDAY TRHOUGH SATURDAY

Fulton Street, north side, from 104.5 feet to 115 feet west of Hyde Street (removes 3 spaces) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board)

17(c). RESCIND – TOUR BUS WHITE LOADING ZONE, 15-MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 8AM to 6PM, EVERYDAY

Fulton Street, north side, from 119 feet to 182 feet east of Larkin Street

Fulton Street, north side, from 117 feet to 175 feet west of Hyde Street (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer)

17(d). RESCIND – PASSENGER LOADING ZONE DURING BUSINESS HOURS, 5- MINUTE TIME LIMIT

Fulton Street south side, from 128.5 feet to 182.5 feet east of Larkin Street Fulton Street, south side, from 110 feet to 176 feet west of Hyde Street (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer)

17(e). RESCIND – BLUE ZONE

A. Fulton Street, north side, from 4 feet to 12.5 feet east of Larkin Street (removes 1 space)

B. Fulton Street, south side, from 5 feet to 14 feet east of Larkin Street (removes 1 space)

C. Fulton Street, north side, from 9 feet to 17.5 feet west of Hyde Street (removes 1 space)

D. Fulton Street, south side, from 4 feet to 12.5 feet west of Hyde Street (removes 1 space) (Approvable by the City Traffic Engineer)

17(f). ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANYTIME

Fulton Street, north side, from Larkin Street to Hyde Street

Fulton Street, south side, from Larkin Street to Hyde Street (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) (Supervisor District 5) Michael Tsai, michael.tsai@sfmta.com

Proposal to remove parking to support the relocation of the Farmer's Market.

Final SFMTA Decisions, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to <u>Ordinance 127-18</u>. Decisions reviewable by the Board of Supervisors are denoted with a pound (**#**).
