I'm pleased to share that we received 269 responses to the Haight bikeshare survey that ran for one month (June 15 through July 15). There is a strong need for additional bikeshare stations in Haight - the two closest bikeshare stations (Carl at Cole and Fell at Stanyan) have averaged ~2,256 start and end rides per month since they were both installed approximately 1 year and 1.5 years ago respectively. This does not include e-bike rides where the Haight neighborhood was a destination, as shown below. These numbers show us that there is a growing demand for bikeshare stations to ensure reliability and organization for both classic and e-bike rides trips to and from the Haight neighborhood.

Hi Matt,

Thank you for your quick response and for sharing your feedback on the proposed bikeshare station on Waller at Stanyan. I hear your concerns surrounding parking conversion. Bikeshare is another method of transportation that people can take in lieu of driving and can occupy more bikes per parking space than a parked car would. This proposed station would fit 19 bikes which could translate to that much more potential FGW customers than 3 single occupancy drivers could within the same footprint. To answer your question, the proposed bikeshare station would convert 3 unmetered spaces across from FGW so it would not convert metered spaces in this case but we have placed stations in metered spaces elsewhere. The Bay Wheels bikeshare program is a private-public partnership with SFMTA which is why the majority of our bikeshare stations are on SFMTA right of way. Thank you for your suggestion to place the station on Stanyan St instead of Waller St. To share a bit about our siting criteria, we typically try to place stations on bike routes that are adjacent to MUNI routes, which is what Waller St achieves - not just for making it safer for our riders but also for the field team to rebalance and maintain the stations more easily without obstructing MUNI routes.

For context, this location on Waller at Stanyan was chosen as a desirable location as the abutting property across the street is slated to become a large affordable housing development and are planning ahead to provide transportation alternatives such as bikeshare for future residents in tandem with MUNI so that those who cannot afford a car or would like more affordable transportation alternatives can have them. In addition, to make the bikeshare network the most effective, we need to fill the gap within the Haight neighborhood as we have stations in the Richmond District, NoPa and the Inner Sunset currently with service within the Haight neighborhood. I had released a neighborhood survey in June where we received 269 responses that showed Waller at Stanyan as one of the top preferred locations for bikeshare.

Thank you for your suggestions to place the station on Stanyan St and in the skate park as alternatives. To share a bit about our siting criteria, we typically try to place stations on bike routes that are adjacent to MUNI routes, which is what Waller St achieves - not just for making it safer for our riders but also for the field team to rebalance and maintain the stations more easily without obstructing MUNI routes. Also that might be helpful to note, the Bay Wheels bikeshare program stems from a 10 year contract with SFMTA that was approved in 2015 by the Board of Supervisors, which allows for the bikeshare stations to be placed on SFMTA right of way. They are meant to be a public benefit for the neighborhood, much like MUNI, at no cost to SFMTA or the taxpayers for the operation and maintenance of the system. As we continue to work with SFMTA to expand the Bay Wheels Bikeshare network throughout San Francisco, the goal of this program is to help SFMTA meet their citywide Transit First Policy and Bike Share Goals.

Thank you for reaching out and sharing your thoughts on the proposed bikeshare station on the North side of Waller St, East of Stanyan St. I hear your concerns surrounding parking conversion on Waller St and that you have families that come pick up food pantry bags and toiletries from Safe & Sound that need parking. Bikeshare is another method of transportation that people can take in lieu of driving and can occupy more bikes per parking space than a parked car would. This proposed station would fit 19 bikes which could translate to that much more potential Safe & Sound clients than 3 cars could within the same footprint. It also appears that Safe & Sound has a white loading zone in front to serve the purpose of pick up and drop offs.

For context, this location on Waller at Stanyan was chosen as a desirable location as the abutting property across the street is slated to become a large affordable housing development and are planning ahead to provide transportation alternatives such as bikeshare for future residents in tandem with MUNI so that those who cannot afford a car or would like more affordable transportation alternatives can have them. In addition, to make the bikeshare network the most effective, we need to fill the gap within the Haight neighborhood as we have stations in the Richmond District, NoPa and the Inner Sunset currently with service within the Haight neighborhood. This project in its approved form has been determined to be exempt from environmental review because it would result in the installation of up to 450 bicycle sharing stations throughout San Francisco, primarily within the public right-of-way and on some parcels. The proposed individual stations are portable, modular, and would be solar and battery powered, and would thus not involve excavation or utility connections. The bicycle sharing station equipment is small in scale and massing relative to surrounding buildings or sites. Bicycle facilities and infrastructure are common sights within the urban environment. There would be no potential for significant environmental impacts at either a project or cumulative level. Therefore, the proposed project would be exempt from environmental review under Class 3.
