Outreach Process (March 15 – April 16, 2021)

- Led **four** virtual open house events, with **44** attendees
- Attended two community-led meetings (Friends of Slow Sanchez and Upper Noe Neighbors)
- Received **1,200** visitors to the Sanchez Virtual Open House
- Collected **277** submissions on the design feedback form
- 26 comments/photos were submitted on the traffic safety map on the Sanchez Slow Street virtual open house webpage

Key Findings from Outreach

Most Slow Streets

Issues: through vehicle traffic and speed, safety of people on bikes and on foot

Roadway design solutions: traffic calming treatments, operational changes



Sanchez Slow Street

Issues: negative impacts of frequent use

Roadway design solutions: encourage use as transportation corridor



Design Feedback Form - Summary

Treatment	% Support	% Oppose	% Neutral
Continental crosswalks	80%	7%	13%
Roadway markings	71%	11%	18%
Left-turn restrictions*	61%	24%	14%
Median diverters*	60%	24%	16%
Intersection daylighting*	58%	29%	13%
Bike sharrows	54%	19%	27%
Speed humps*	52%	33%	15%

* Treatments intended to address issues not reported on Sanchez Street
