• 5:51pm Robert Lim- Update on Shuttle Program

- Hiring a 3rd party to run the actual program (get the vehicles etc.)
- Facing staffing issues and prioritizing the previous contract made to get workers.
- Aiming to put out RFP (request for proposal) in next month and have a vendor with approved contract late this year.
- Aiming to start service in early 2024

 - Hard to find one in the first place given few vendors provide on demand shuttle services.
 - Several companies have responded, and they will be on the list to receive the contract, but few have worked with the MTA before

- Effort to engage the BVHP public on creating the program for the shuttle that meets community needs; began efforts in April 2023
- Held 17 different events across the BVHP with various community centers.
- Have conducted close to 500 surveys seeking to identify travel times and locations.
 - Also how far are you willing to walk or wait for a shuttle to pick up?

- Age Requirements for Shuttle?
 - Will depend on the vendor; some may want to restrict youth to travel with an adult.
 - Are working to analyze data from more youth to see what their needs are and will update the council on results
- Question about survey language?
 - Survey available in multiple languages
- What is the largest vehicle size for this program?
 - Grant calls for zero emission vehicles
 - Envision minivans and cars able to navigate diverse landscapes; probably the largest vehicle will hold 15 people.
- Will this program service the market zone (production/distribution district)
 - Will in theory service this zone
- Will this be 24/7?
 - Because the grant is finite, it will be a balance of service zoning and hours serviced.
- What will the fare be? Some people cannot even afford the MUNI pass.
 - Supposedly it will be the same as the MUNI fare.
 - Working to see if there can be discounted MUNI passes or if there can be a monthly MUNI pass.
 - Working with the transportation resource center to make transportation accessible to all.
- Request to have the survey takers connect more to the African American community, churches/religious community and hospital.
- Statement: Bayshore Caltrain is very important to BVHP community
- Where will the fare revenue from the program go?
 - To fund the program itself
- What types of jobs will be available to the BVHP community?



- Types of positions and job training positions will be determined based on the vendor.
