Proposal installs a traffic calming device west of the intersection at the request of District

2. RESCIND – PART-TIME BUS ZONE, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY, 6 AM TO 7 PM Jackson Street, north side, from 125 feet to 162 feet west of Fillmore Street (Supervisor District 2) (Requires approval by the SFMTA Board) Vanessa See, vanessa.see@sfmta.com

Proposal to remove a 37-foot-long part-time bus zone extension in effect from 6 AM to 7 PM, Monday through Friday. Restores approximately 2 residential permit parking spaces.

Proposal to convert residential permit parking into general metered parking to address parking availability issues on Fillmore Street.

San Bruno Avenue, between Division Street and Alameda Street – Parking Meters ESTABLISH – GENERAL METERED PARKING, NO TIME LIMIT, 9 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

<u>Mission Street, between 3rd Street and The Embarcadero – Mission Street Safety</u> Improvements Project

6(a). ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO STOPPING ANY TIME (for sidewalk widening)Mission Street, south side, from 2nd Street to 115 feet westerly (6-foot-wide transit bulb)

6(b). ESTABLISH – NO PARKING ANY TIME (for sidewalk widening)

- **A.** Mission Street, south side, from New Montgomery Street to 91 feet westerly (6-footwide bulb)
- **B.** Mission Street, south side, from 2nd Street to 60 feet easterly (6-foot-wide bulb)
- **C.** Mission Street, south side, from Shaw Alley to 68 feet westerly (4-foot-wide bulb)
- **D.** Mission Street, south side, from Beale Street to 40 feet easterly (5-foot-wide bulb)
- E. Mission Street, south side, from Spear Street to 38 feet westerly (6-foot-wide bulb)

Mission Street, south side, from 115 feet to 140 feet east of 2nd Street



6(d). ESTABLISH - BUS ZONE

Mission Street, south side, from Main Street to 150 feet easterly (extends existing bus zone by 27 feet)

6(e). ESTABLISH – YELLOW METERED ZONE, COMMERCIAL LOADING, 30-MINUTE TIME LIMIT, 7 AM TO 6 PM, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY

- A. Mission Street, south side, from 91 feet to 201 feet west of New Montgomery Street
- B. Mission Street, south side, from 48 feet to 73 feet east of New Montgomery Street
- C. Mission Street, south side, from 103 feet to 147 feet east of 2nd Street
- D. Mission Street, south side, from 44 feet to 88 feet west of Main Street
- E. Mission Street, south side, from 38 feet to 126 feet west of Spear Street

6(f). ESTABLISH – WHITE ZONE, PASSENGER LOADING, 5-MINUTE TIME LIMIT, AT ALL TIMES

6(g). ESTABLISH - BLUE ZONE

Mission Street, south side, from 48 feet to 71 feet east of Spear Street

6(h). ESTABLISH – TOW-AWAY, NO PARKING, PERMITTED COMMUTER SHUTTLE BUS ZONE, 6 AM TO 8 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY

Proposal to implement The Mission Street Safety Improvements Project, which is part of a larger neighborhood-wide community planning initiative called the South Downtown Design + Activation Plan (Soda). Soda seeks to create vibrant streets and revitalizing open spaces, while encouraging active transportation choices, as the East Cut neighborhood grows. The Mission Street Safety Project would add additional sidewalk widening at various corners and include elements like additional streetlighting and placemaking. The project compliments improvements from the Mission Street SoMa Transit Improvements Project.

ADJOURNMENT

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: For Approval Actions, the Planning Department has issued a CEQA exemption determination or negative declaration, which may be viewed online at http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447. Following approval of the item by the SFMTA City Traffic Engineer, the CEQA determination is subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16, typically within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action. For information on filing a CEQA appeal, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors or other City board, commission or department at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.



Whether the City Traffic Engineer's decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision is determined by Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. If the City Traffic Engineer approves a parking or traffic modification, this decision is considered a Final SFMTA Decision. If a City Traffic Engineer disapproves a parking or traffic modification and a member of the public requests SFMTA review of that decision, the additional review shall be conducted pursuant to Division II, Section 203 of the Transportation Code. City Traffic Engineer decisions will be posted on SFMTA.com/EngineeringResults by 5 p.m. on the Friday following the public hearing. Final SFMTA Decisions involving certain parking or traffic modifications, whether made by the City Traffic Engineer or the SFMTA Board, can be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to Ordinance 127-18.
