Project Goals

- SFPUC: Reduce the amount of stormwater going into the combined sewer system
- SFMTA: Improve conditions for people who walk, bike and live along the Wiggle
 - Ensure that pedestrians feel safe crossing the street
 - Minimize congestion from motor vehicles
 - Encourage slow, safe speeds from all roadway users

Project Timeline

- Planning & Outreach May 2013 to Jan 2014
- Environmental Review Feb 2014 to Oct 2015
- Detailed Design (on-going) Summer to Fall 2015
- Legislation (current phase) Fall 2015
- Bid/Award/Construction (estimated) 2016 to 2017

Community Outreach

- 4 Community Meetings
- Over 20 smaller meetings with stakeholder groups
- Ongoing communication through email, neighborhood groups, etc
- Public Hearing in April, 2015
